What is an SCA?


- Single County Authority -SCA The county agency responsible for program planning.
- Administration of State and Federally Funded Grant Agreements.

What is DDAP?

- PA Cabinet Level Agency
- D and A Licensing
- Central Planning
- Administration
- Monitoring

SCA

- Approve Contracts
- Purchase Services
- Disburse Funds for Services
- Monitor Delivery of Services
- Accountable to DDAP



Treatment and Supports

- ▣ Levels of Treatment in the Drug and Alcohol System.
 - Outpatient levels
 - Inpatient Levels
 - Housing
 - Recovery Supports
- ▣ Required license to receive state/county funding
- ▣ Required assessment prior to entry to service

Drug and Alcohol Case Management and Non-Treatment Needs

- ▣ DCM Diversified Care Management – ICM Services
 - Level of Case Management Determination Form
 - 12 Domains
 - Accessing D and A Case Management Services

Emergent Care

- ▣ The DDAP emergent care screening must be administered to identify emergent needs, such as detox, psychiatric or medical



Intervention

- Provide supports such as groups, housing, hotlines, and outreach, to individual adults, or primary caregivers and their children, who are in early recovery or experiencing ongoing negative effects of past substance use or current substance use.
- Utilize available information concerning needs and resources to better meet existing needs, especially those of priority populations.

Prevention

- Six federal strategies: including drug education and resiliency skill building, drug free social activities, and drug prevention-community coalition building.
- Promotes use of evidence based programs and practices.
- Resources directed toward general and target populations identified as at risk for substance use.
- Student assistance Program (SAP)- Prevention and Early Intervention Programs for Secondary Grade levels.
- Delivered in schools, community centers, faith based institutions;
- At community wide events, after school programs, and summer camps.

ROSC

Recover Oriented Systems of Care

PERSON-CENTERED

- ▣ Individuality is recognized and respected.
- ▣ Client makes informed decisions about the strategies and supports included in their plan for growth in recovery
- ▣ Natural community supports utilized.

STRENGTHS-BASED

- ▣ Strengths are identified and incorporated into recovery planning.
- ▣ Past successes acknowledged and built upon.
- ▣ Inner resources are affirmed, sustained, and utilized to drive the recovery process.

ACT 53

- ▣ Provides a legal basis for parents/ legal guardians to petition Juvenile Court to order their child (age 12-17) into involuntary treatment.
- ▣ Point of access – contact county Drug and Alcohol Bureau -SCA
- ▣ A care manager will screen the case to insure criteria is met. If the case is appropriate the care manager will guide the parent through the Act 53 process.
