## Council Seeks Volunteers for Council of Friends of the Parks

July is America's "Park and Recreation Month" and the theme for 2014: "Out is In" provides an opportunity for people to get outside and get involved in their community through parks and recreation. Council encourages Allegheny County residents with an interest in parks and recreation to consider volunteering for the Council of Friends of the Parks.



As champions of our parks, Friends frequently engage area communities in the park and volunteer time in support of park priorities. Members serve two (2) year terms as advisors and do not receive compensation for their service. The members include, to the extent possible, representation from the labor, the disability community, education, environmental advocates, sports and athletics programs, landscape architecture and historic preservation. All groups meet at the call of the chair, but typically meet one time a month.

"We are striving to encourage more people of all ages to become active members of the Council of Friends of the Parks, to help us develop these groups so that they are truly representative of the communities they serve," stated Councilman Ed Kress. "We need all kinds of people with different skills to become Friends."

Established by Allegheny County Council in 2002, the Council of Friends of the Parks has been Allegheny County's strongest public advocate for the protection, preservation and improvement of the County's nine (9) regional parks. The parks include Boyce Park, Deer Lakes Park, Harrison Hills Park, Hartwood Acres Park, North Park, Round Hill Park, Settler's Cabin Park, South Park and White Oak Park. The Friends groups help to preserve, protect and improve these parks and to foster appreciation for the parks' many contributions to the quality of life in Allegheny County.

Councilman Nick Futules, Chairman of the Parks Committee, noted "The Council of Friends bring ideas and suggestions from the community on issues of concern or improvements needed in the park to the attention of County Council. The Friends members play a valuable role in the upkeep and enjoyment of our parks and green-spaces."

### Council Recognizes 100th Anniversary of Extension




On Tuesday, May 6th, Allegheny County Council recognized and congratulated the Cooperative Extension of The Pennsylvania State University on its 100th anniversary. The May 8th anniversary date marks the signing of the Smith-Lever Act which established the Cooperative Extension, the nationwide transformational education system operating through Land-Grant universities in partnership with federal, state, and local governments.

The Cooperative Extension, funded through the U.S. Department of Agriculture, state and county governments, engages with urban and rural learners through practical, community-based, and online approaches. The program encourages healthful lifestyle choices, community vitality, and works to ensure a safe and abundant food supply. Classes are available for children and adults in a wide variety of topics, including: animals, plants and pests, natural resources, community and business, food and health, and youth and family.

“The Penn State Cooperative Extension has been a great partner with Allegheny County,” said Councilman Mike Finnerty. “The Extension’s educational programs, classes, and expos are a benefit to our residents and help to protect our natural resources.”

Deno DeCiantis, Executive Director for The Penn State Center Pittsburgh said, “Our Extension program in Allegheny County continues to expand its capabilities and has allowed residents to utilize Penn State’s resources and expertise to improve their families, businesses, communities, and environment. ## Women's History Month



Each year during the month of June, Council presents the Obediah Cole Foundation for Prostate Cancer a proclamation that recognizes the organization for their tireless efforts to raise awareness about prostate cancer.

This year, Council designated the week of June 15th as "Prostate Cancer Awareness Week" in Allegheny County. The fountain in the middle of the Allegheny County Courthouse Courtyard was dyed blue in June in recognition of Prostate Cancer Awareness Week in Allegheny County.

Jerry Bortman of the Obediah Cole Foundation for Prostate Cancer stopped by the June 3rd Regular Meeting of Council to speak about the dangers of prostate cancer, to promote the organization's 12th annual Father's Day 5k/10k Run/Walk on June 15, 2014 at the River Front Park on Pittsburgh's North Shore, and to accept a proclamation in honor of the foundation's efforts. The annual run/walk offers free examinations.



Council honored two of their own members on April 22, 2014, when Council President John DeFazio and Councilman Chuck Martoni were recognized, along with Bill Cardille, for being inducted into Pittsburgh's

Keystone State Wrestling Alliance (KSWA) Hall of Fame Class of 2014. Powerhouse "Jumpin' Johnny" DeFazio is a four-time World Wide Wrestling Federation (WWWF) World Junior Heavyweight Champion. Dr. Martoni, who wrestled as "Cannonball" and "The Masked Marvel" entertained Pittsburgh audiences in "90 minutes of unorganized mayhem, featuring the greatest wrestlers in the world." "Chilly" Bill Cardille became a Saturday night institution broadcasting studio wrestling until it went off the air in 1974.



At-Large Council Member Heather S. Heidelbaugh, in recognition of Women's History Month, honored local actress Helena Ruoti, a resident of Mt. Lebanon who, throughout her life and career, has exemplified what it means to be a woman of character, courage, and commitment, the theme of 2014's Women's History Month.

The proclamation read in part, "Through her careful and contemplative selection process for the roles she chooses to take on, Ms. Ruoti has crafted her image as a woman that transcends traditional "gender roles" by promoting the accomplishments of women, encouraging women to stand up for their beliefs and future aspirations, and by acting as a role model for what can be achieved through dedication, hard work, and perseverance."



Also in recognition of Women's History Month, Councilwoman Heidelbaugh, along with County Controller Chelsa Wagner, honored the Brookline Regional Catholic School girls' basketball team in recognition of earning the school's first undefeated Class B Girls' JV Basketball Diocesan Championship. Although Council designated March 2014 as "Women's History Month" in Allegheny County, Ms. Ruoti and the Brookline Regional Catholic School girls' basketball team attended Council's Regular Meeting held in April.



On June 28, 2014, Councilman Bob Macey attended the Court of Honor ceremony at the Port Vue Firehall to recognize Devon Nemeth of Boy Scout Troop 57 for earning his Eagle Scout rank. For his Eagle Scout project, Mr. Nemeth constructed and placed eighteen bird houses at three schools within the South Allegheny School District. The houses will provide homes for three types of birds already nesting in the area, including Blue Jays, Cardinals and Wrens.



## South Park Flag Retirement Ceremony Postponed

Each year, Allegheny County Council sponsors the South Park Flag Retirement program in conjunction with Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald. The program is a unique and fun way to bring the South Hills communities together in celebration and remembrance of Flag Day. The program is comprised of patriotic music performed by County residents, remarks by local and state elected officials emphasizing the importance of Flag Day and the United States Flag, local veterans' organizations performing 21 gun salutes, JROTC organizations presenting the colors, and local Scouting organizations facilitating the actual retiring of the worn and unusable flags.

After months of diligent work and preparations, the coordination of the performers, Scouting groups, elected officials and other instrumental actors in the program, the 2014 Ceremony, for the first time in its eight year existence, had to be postponed, from its original date of June 11, due to heavy rains and strong winds that were experienced throughout the County.

While the postponement of the Ceremony was a difficult pill to swallow for all of those who planned, or were scheduled to participate in the program, there is still hope for it to take place for the eighth year in a row. With the quick thinking and guidance of the program's lead planner, Council's Director of Constituent Services & Government Relations, Joe Catanese, Council members and the County Executive were able to find a make-up date in late July which will allow for everyone who wanted to be in attendance, to be there.


