12 of March 2012 Irish Heritage Month in Allegheny County.
13 Sponsored by Council Members Finnerty, Danko, Ellenbogen,
14 Green Hawkins, Macey, Palmiere and Gastgeb.
15 MR. FINNERTY: Thank you, Mr. President. We
16 have a few people here with us from the AOH, I believe;
17 correct, Jim Green and Jim Caldwell?
18 MR. GREEN: Yeah, and the parade committee.
19 MR. FINNERTY: And the parade committee. So
20 come on up. The AOH is an Irish organization. It's
21 called the Ancient Order of Hibernians. I like to say
22 it's America's holy hope. And it is the oldest Irish
23 group in, actually, the world, I believe. And also we're

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1 joined by the Knights of Equity and other Irish
2 organizations like the Emerald Society that --- we've just
3 had a tremendous parade. And we thank all of Pittsburgh
4 for coming out for that parade. It was well over 300,000
5 people. You could hardly move. It was great. But us
6 Irish people got sunburned then.
7 But I would like to mention also that the
8 Ancient Order of Hibernians' motto is friendship, unity
9 and Christian charity. And one of the main functions of
10 all Irish groups, actually, is Christian charity. One of
11 the biggest things we do is donate money to different
12 organizations that are in need. And I think it's
13 important that you realize that. The Ancient Order of
14 Hibernians was established originally to protect the
15 Catholic priests in Ireland because the Catholic priests
16 in Ireland were being put in prison. This was during ---
17 when England occupied all of Ireland. And that's why this
18 order was established. Today we don't have to do that
19 anymore, so we have our purpose as a charitable
20 organization today. I'd like to read the proclamation,
21 and I'm going to read two of them. One is from Council
22 and the other is from our Chief Executive, Rich
23 Fitzgerald.

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1 Whereas, Irish-Americans have long enjoyed a
2 rich and proud history throughout Allegheny County, the
3 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and our nation.
4 And whereas, fleeing from the atrocities of
5 poverty, famine and political oppression of their beloved
6 native land, Ireland, immigrants turned hopeful eyes
7 towards the promising shores of America.
8 And whereas, inspired by an irrepressible spirit
9 of their patron saint, St. Patrick, Irish-Americans
10 dedicated themselves to the development of this nation and
11 the establishment of their legacy upon its history.
12 And whereas, those of Irish descent have
13 significantly contributed to the rich history, cultural
14 diversity and national identity of our country. And we,
15 as citizens and communities take time to fully recognize
16 and appreciate those invaluable contributions.
17 Now, therefore, be it resolved that the
18 Allegheny County Council does hereby proclaim March 2012
19 as Irish Heritage Month in Allegheny County. We encourage
20 all citizens to celebrate the richness of the
21 Irish-American culture and recognize its prominence in
22 American identity. This is sponsored by myself,
23 Councilman Mike Finnerty, Barb Daly Danko, Jim Ellenbogen,

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1 Vince Gastgeb, Amanda Green Hawkins, Bob Macey, John
2 Palmiere, and is presented this 20th day of March, 2011
3 --- '12. I'm living in the past.
4 MR. CATANESE: Also, Councilman DeFazio is a
5 sponsor.
6 MR. FUTULES: Myself, too, please.
7 MR. FINNERTY: And also Matt Drozd and
8 Councilman John DeFazio and --- who did we add today?
9 MR. ELLENBOGEN: William Russell.
10 MR. FINNERTY: William Russell Robinson and
11 Councilwoman Jan Rea. Thank you. I appreciate your
12 sponsorship. I'd like to read the proclamation from the
13 County Exec.
14 Whereas, Allegheny County has been rich in Irish
15 tradition since the arrival of the first Irish settlers in
16 1700.
17 And whereas, the Irish immigrants that relocated
18 to this area left their families, homes, possessions and
19 everything they knew to start a new life, and the spirit
20 of determination and charity can still be seen in their
21 ancestry today.
22 And whereas, a great number of Irish
23 associations are active in Allegheny County. Each works

<p style="text-align: right;">Page 10</p> <p>1 to preserve the Irish culture in our region through a 2 variety of means, including art, dance, music and sports. 3 And whereas, on of the most acclaimed traditions 4 in the area is the annual St. Patrick's Day Parade in 5 Pittsburgh, with the first festivals being held in 1869. 6 Today around 350,000 people came out to join the 7 celebration, making it the second largest St. Patrick's 8 Day Parade in the United States. 9 And whereas, strong Irish influences can be seen 10 through the region, with approximately 15 percent of the 11 Allegheny County residents claiming Irish ancestry, making 12 the Irish the second highest ancestry group within the 13 county. 14 Now, therefore, be it resolved that I, Allegheny 15 County Executive Rich Fitzgerald, by virtue of the 16 authority vested in me, do hereby proclaim March 2012 to 17 be Irish Heritage Month in Allegheny County. In witness 18 whereof, I have unto set my hand and caused the seal of 19 the County of Allegheny to be affixed this 20th day of 20 March 2012. 21 (Applause.) 22 MR. We do work with the food bank. 3 Every month we have a regular schedule where we work with 4 the veterans' hospitals. We do a number of things from a 5 charitable prospective. But we also, as an organization, 6 are active politically, politically from the perspective 7 of our U.S. government and how we can try to improve the 8 peace process over in northern Ireland. We were here a 9 couple years ago to ask for and we received a proclamation 10 promoting the idea of the United Ireland, and we were very 11 appreciative of that as well. FINNERTY: He was the state president. I 5 was former president of AOH 32 at one time. 6 MR. GREEN: Thank you, Mike. We appreciate it. 7 Thank you very much. And thank you very much for having 8 us. And we certainly appreciate the proclamations. As 9 Mike mentioned with the parade, it was truly an awesome 10 experience only three days ago, and I still can't quite 11 shake it, you know. There was a lot of work that went 12 into it. We have dozens of people on our parade committee 13 that worked very hard since last September putting this 14 parade together, working with the city and county offices 15 to ensure that we would have a civilized family-oriented 16 atmosphere for our parade. And I think for the very most 17 part, that was true. I saw more kids along the parade 18 route this year than I have in years, and I'm very proud 19 of that. We're all very proud of that. And it was nice to walk down there and see all the 3 children and the families. And we've been after this. 4 Jim worked very hard, along with other members of the AOH. 5 The ladies got into this too. And they all worked hard to 6 clean up some of the bad aspects. Some of the riotous 7 behavior has now been turned to face painting for kids and 8 so forth. And we have reprimanded the media because we 9 had a 30,000 parade --- a couple hundred thousand watching 10 the parade every year. 20 areas that are eligible for this, and some of the areas
21 are Allegheny Valley North, Harrison Township,
22 Brackenridge, Tarentum, West Mifflin, Carnegie, Crafton,
23 Wilkinsburg, Rankin, Glassport, McKees Rocks, Stowe

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1 Township, Millvale, Etna, Sharpsburg, Pitcairn, White Oak,
2 Shaler. They also have, in relation to this, certain
3 areas that seem to be affluent that have pockets of
4 poverty in that area: Dormont, Baldwin, Scott Township,
5 Forward Township, Ingram, Harmar Township, Brentwood,
6 Castle Shannon, West Elizabeth, Sharpsburg and
7 Bridgeville.
8 It's an important program. If you would like,
9 you can call either our Human Services or Just Harvest.
10 And Just Harvest's number is 1-888-FOOD-210. They also
11 have a website for Just Harvest. It's
12 www.justharvest.org. They are looking for sites to run
13 the program. This program has been going on for quite a
14 while. The majority of people that actually are eligible
15 for this program do not participate in it. So it's
16 important that if you think you'd like to participate,
17 that you do call.
18 This is for children from 1 to 18 years old.
19 It's an important program to get them some food. Usually
20 they qualify these different towns and townships in
21 relation to the children that are on the free lunch
22 program in the schools. So obviously, during the summer,
23 there is no school, so that some of these children don't

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1 get fed in the summer. So if you would like to call in
2 about that or go to justharvest.org and give them some
3 information in that regard ---. I know that in Carnegie,
4 that the Carnegie Boys and Girls Club on Washington Avenue
5 is participating so that people in the Carnegie area down
6 there have a chance to get some --- it's breakfast and
7 lunch for these people, for these children. So I think
8 it's a very, very important program for them. Thank you,
9 Mr. President.
10 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Thank you. Mr. Ellenbogen,
11 and then Mr. Macey and then Mr. Drozd.
12 MR. ELLENBOGEN: Thank you, Mr. President and
13 members of Council. A little more than maybe 11 or 12
14 days ago, we had a serious tragedy that had happened at
15 Western Psych Hospital where a young person lost his life
16 and many other individuals were also wounded. It raises
17 the question in terms of should hospitals or areas that

19 an open place like that, should there be armed guards?
20 Personally, I'm convinced that had there not been for the
21 thoughtfulness of the chief of the University of
22 Pittsburgh Police Force and the two officers that happened
23 to be there, that this --- terrible as that carnage was,

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1 it would have --- could have been more horrible had those
 2 two people not been there, what this individual could have
 3 done had these gentlemen not put him down.
 4 First of all, I would ask you, Mr. President, to
 5 ask the Chief Clerk not only to contact the chief and find
 6 out who these officers are --- I think that they are
 7 worthy of being given an honor from this county. Both of
 8 them had saved many lives. Also, to honor the chief for
 9 his thoughtfulness. I can remember --- and there's
 10 actually a couple gentlemen in the audience here who's
 11 trained with me in the '90s when we were training for
 12 terrorist response for the county. And you know, we kind
 13 of rolled our eyes a little bit. It was before the days
 14 of 9/11. It was before the days that anyone ever thought
 15 of these kind of things. And we were kind of --- okay.
 16 We did it. And I look back on that. Well, you know, you
 17 have to ask yourself --- you know, there are those who say
 18 that, well, you know, maybe you armed officers aren't the
 19 answer. I don't really know what the answer is. All I
 20 know is that the world that I grew up in is not the same
 21 world that these young people live in today and the
 22 society we live in today. I know that it's a fact that if

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1 those two University of Pittsburgh officers aren't there,
 2 God knows how many people could have been killed.
 3 I take a special heartbreak in that family that
 4 lost their child. I have a child the same age who interns
 5 numerous times in her field of work at that hospital.
 6 It's a terrible thing. And as the Public Safety Chair,
 7 I'm asking the other members of Council if maybe there's
 8 something we, as a Council, can do in terms of having a
 9 public safety meeting, talking with maybe some of the
 10 emergency response people, some of the major institutions
 11 of this county to see what --- any laws or anything that
 12 we could do as a Council or in terms of what we could even
 13 respond with our people. The officers that did respond
 14 did a wonderful job. The SWAT Team did a wonderful job.
 15 Unfortunately, you know, we lost a wonderful
 16 young man who had a lot to contribute to this society and
 17 this county. And it's something, like I said, that rings
 18 very true to me. And the world we live in, it is --- you
 19 know, we are the representatives of the people. And if
 20 there's anything that we can do, I would ask any --- you
 21 know, to tell me your thoughts. Tell me what you think
 22 and maybe we could contribute to something. I don't know.
 23 But just not doing anything just doesn't seem to be an

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1 option for me. Thank you, Mr. President and members of

6 have these meetings, it's probably more complex when half
7 of them, the numbers are bad numbers. And then I have
8 people I represent that, know there acceptance is still
9 low and half of them notice that and they're lacking and
10 will have to go to meetings like in my district on March
11 8th. And what I will predict is that the people of my
12 district to appeal have to meet with an appraiser at the
13 meeting to get information. And whatever the rate is
14 right now is the average where I represent will go down,
15 because people will win their appeals, creating even a
16 bigger difference between my district and the different
17 towns that the assessment was supposed to help, because I
18 don't think those people, if they want to appeal, would
19 have the same means of information that other people in
20 the county will. So I just wanted to put that on the
21 record. Thank you.
22 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Thank you. John DeFazio?

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1 MR. DEFAZIO: Let me ask you, Jared or someone,
2 does anyone have a schedule? We might as well just read
3 them all off, because there's a few that weren't read.
4 MR. BARKER: I actually do not have one on me.
5 We can get one, e-mail it to the Council members,
6 distribute it however you'd like.
7 MR. DEFAZIO: Well, it's not important to us.
8 MR. CATANESE: It's also on the county website.

10 the betterment of the people, because a lot of people say

21 Road, Pittsburgh, PA, 15236. Councilman Ellenbogen also
22 mentioned his, which is at 590 Crane Avenue, Brashear High
23 School, Pittsburgh, PA, 15216, and it's at 7:00 p.m.

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1 That's Thursday, the 29th. Councilwoman Green Hawkins
2 also mentioned hers, which was April 2nd at 7:00 p.m., at
3 CCAC Allegheny Campus, 808 Ridge Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA,
4 15212 --- yeah, 212. Myself, I mentioned mine, which is
5 Wednesday, April 4th, 7:00 p.m. at Chartiers Valley
6 Intermediate School, 2030 Swallow Hill Road, Pittsburgh,
7 PA, 15220. Councilman Burn's is Thursday, April 12th at
8 7:00 p.m. It's at Shaler Area High School. It's 381
9 Wilbe Run Road.
10 MR. DEFAZIO: Wible.
11 MR. FINNERTY: Wible?
12 MR. DEFAZIO: Wible.
13 MR. FINNERTY: Okay. Thank you. Pittsburgh,
14 PA, 15209. I have got them all, I think.

8 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Opposed? So ordered.
9 Public comment on general items.
10 MR. CATANESE: We have two.
11 PRESIDENT MARTONI: We have two. We have Harry
12 Liller will be our first speaker. Harry?
13 MR. LILLER: My name's Harry Liller, 438 Ruxton
14 Street, Pittsburgh, PA. That's the Mount Washington
15 section of Pittsburgh. I'm here to speak about the 22nd
16 District that's coming under election next month. The
17 people of Beechview has always voted Frank Gigliotti into
18 this spot, but he was corrupt and went to jail. So I'm
19 bringing up a candidate that you should endorse. Her name
20 is Erin Moichany. She does not know I'm saying this. I
21 do not work for her, and she did not tell me to do this.
22 But to the people of Baldwin, Beechview and Mount
23 Washington, she is an honest, decent woman who would

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1 actually do good things for us and not be part of
2 kickbacks and payoffs which goes on in this city.
3 I would also like to complain about Rick
4 Santorum. I actually confronted him once on the
5 Pennsylvania Cable Network. I told him over the telephone
6 that you're the biggest cheerleader for the stadium tax
7 here. And they cut me off and he said, no, no, no. I'm
8 for economic development. For the record, the stadium tax
9 was a rise in a sales tax for the people of Allegheny
10 County.
11 I wish the media and the politicians in this
12 town would tell Grover Norquist that he was with Santorum
13 being a cheerleader for the tax increase. His hypocrisy
14 knows no bounds. When Rick Santorum was confronted about
15 his novel, he said, it wasn't me. It was my wife. When
16 he stated that he does not want black people to get
17 government money, he said that was not him. But if you
18 look at the camera, not a computer, that's what he said.
19 He said, I do not want black people getting government
20 money. So Rick Santorum is a hypocrite, a racist, a
21 fascist, a money-grubber. He also did the earmark for the
22 North Shore Connector while the Pittsburgh media goes
23 around blaming the Democrats.

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1 When I brought this up last month with my letter
2 to Tom Corbett, he still has not acknowledged my letter.
3 The media has not acknowledged Tom Corbett. And the media
4 loves the corrupt, conservative Republicans who screw us
5 time and time again. So when Santorum comes to this city
6 next month, I'd like you to invite him to this Council so
7 I can tell him right to his face, like I told him on
8 Pennsylvania Cable Network, that he's a hypocrite.
9 But that's what goes on in this town because the
10 media does not do their job. The media has a moral
11 obligation to tell the public what goes on in public
12 meetings. But the media has no morals. At the Port
13 Authority meeting last month, the 300 people cheered me
14 like I scored a touchdown in the Super Bowl. But the
15 media cut off the cameras and made fun of me. This is how
16 corrupt it is in this town.
17 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Thank you, Mr. Liller. Jim
18 Roach? Jim?
19 MR. ROACH: Good evening. My name is Jim Roach
20 of 3472 Thornwood Drive, Bethel Park, PA. I'm a 40-year
21 employee of Allegheny County and currently a district
22 supervisor for the Department of Public Works, a position
23 I've held for the past 29 years. I'm here today with

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1 several other supervisors seeking intervention from
2 Council. We have attempted to resolve our conflict on a
3 departmental level several times in 2010, '11 and 2012.
4 Hopefully, my brief presentation to you this evening will,
5 at the very least, make our plight known to Council.
6 We feel that compared to the City of Pittsburgh
7 and PennDOT supervisors, we have been treated unfairly
8 with regard to both pay levels and benefit packages. As
9 you can see from the provided documentation, supervisor-
10 level employees for both the City of Pittsburgh and state
11 are base salaries between \$10,000 and \$15,000 more than
12 their county counterparts. By way of a brief overview,
13 county supervisors have only received total raises of
14 \$1.28 over the past ten years, compared to the union
15 employee raises of \$5.23. In addition, our healthcare
16 costs have doubled in 2009 and again in 2011.
17 I'm sure you are aware, as in any organization,
18 it is difficult, if not impossible, to both hire and keep
19 quality employees if the competition can offer better pay
20 and benefits. In order to maintain a higher level of
21 competency and efficiency, Allegheny County must attempt
22 to offer competitive wages to the current and future
23 supervisors. For far too long, the county has had to make

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1 do with less, and we feel that Council has the insight to
2 correct the injustices that I hope we brought to your
3 attention. I will be happy to discuss with any of you the
4 facts and figures I have presented this evening. Thank
5 you for your time and opportunity you have given us this
6 evening.
7 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Thank you. Motion for
8 adjournment?
9 (Chorus of motions.)
10 (Chorus of seconds.)
11 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Moved and second. Question?
12 All in favor? So ordered.
