

1 PRESIDENT MARTONI: The August 28, 2012 County
 2 Council meeting will come to order. Please rise for the

 4 McCandless.

 6 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Please remain standing for a
 7 moment of silent prayer.
 8 (Moment of silent prayer.)
 9 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Please be seated. Roll
 10 call.
 11 MR. CATANESE: Mr. Burn?

 44 Certificates. 7114-12.

1 MR. CATANESE: Certificate of Recognition
 2 honoring C.J. Coyne, for being selected to sing the
 3 National Anthem in The Dark Knight Rises. Sponsored by
 4 Councilman Burn.
 5 MR. BURN: Thank you, Mr. President, and members
 6 of Council. C.J., I would like you to join me here at the
 7 podium; if any members of your family that are with you,
 8 if they would like to come up, as well. I'd just like to
 9 say a few remarks. When I first heard the story about
 10 you, I believe you're a student in the district, District
 11 3, where I serve as councilman. You're also a resident of
 12 McCandless. So I know that Councilwoman Rea is not here
 13 tonight; so Joe, we can circle back to the councilwoman.
 14 And we're honored to have Councilwoman Jan Rea as a
 15 co-sponsor, because Jan Rea is the councilwoman for
 16 McCandless.
 17 Those who may not recognize C.J. tonight, that's
 18 because C.J. is not in wardrobe. If you have seen The Dark
 19 Knight Rises, and the scene where Bane takes over the
 20 stadium, C.J. is the young man who sings the National
 21 Anthem. One of the previews for The Dark Knight Rises was
 22 actually one in which C.J. was actually featured, and you
 23 can hear C.J. singing while some of the highlights of the
 24 film were introduced to the audience. It's a celebration
 25 on a multitude of dimensions, I would suggest. It's a
 26 celebration again that the Pittsburgh area, the Tri-State
 27 area, this region of the United States, has again stood
 28 out as an area for which folks come and invest, whether
 29 it's industry, whether it's business, whether it's sports
 30 greats who come to play here, whether it's sports teams
 31 who invest here, and now whether it's the film industry.
 32 There are a diverse amount of amenities in this
 33 region that have drawn folks from a variety of
 34 demographics here to live, work and to do business. And
 35 the film industry has been no exception. Years ago, they
 36 filmed Hoffa here, Innocent Blood, The Cemetery Club, back
 37 20 years ago. In the last 20 years --- Bruce Willis has
 38 done Three Rivers, and on and on and on --- filmmakers
 39 have come here. So that dimension is a celebration.
 40 Another dimension is the opportunity for our leaders to
 41 market this community because of that exposure. And
 42 thirdly and importantly, it's given our region an
 43 opportunity to show off not just our material and business
 44 assets, but those special assets that are our residents
 45 and members of our community, especially as it relates to

1 the young men and women of our community who are going to
 2 be our future leaders. Often times --- and Councilman
 3 Gastgeb and I say this quite a bit when we bring young men
 4 and women up here for athletic awards and
 5 presentations --- that most times when you look on the TV
 6 or when you are listening to a radio story or reading an
 7 article about our children, unfortunately, because it
 8 sells papers and commercials, we usually read something
 9 that's adverse. Not enough positive print or attention is
 10 drawn to the young men and women here, or anywhere else,
 11 for that matter that do positive things that are stepping
 12 up to be future leaders. C.J. is one of those folks; a
 13 very gifted singer, an unlimited future. And he was part
 14 of film history here in Allegheny County for a movie that
 15 has become an epic, a conclusion to the trilogy that will
 16 be forever remembered as one of the greatest pieces of
 17 filmmaking in Hollywood history. And C.J., one of our
 18 own, as along with many others, were a part of that
 19 special film making.
 20 So C.J., I just want to bring you up here to say
 21 that we recognize young men and women like you who do the
 22 good things, who are going to be future leaders, who have
 23 God-given talents and aren't afraid to step up and show
 24 the world what we have to look forward to as you go
 25 through life and become one of the leaders of our
 26 community in the future. And with that, Mr. President, I
 27 would like to read the proclamation into the record. Now,
 28 we had asked C.J. if he wanted to sing, but he wasn't ---
 29 he wasn't going to do that tonight. Like any other
 30 professional, he wanted to make sure he did the
 31 National --- or the pledge for us. And C.J., thanks so
 32 much for doing that.
 33 This Certificate of Recognition is awarded to
 34 C.J. Coyne, a resident of the Town of McCandless, for
 35 being selected to sing the National Anthem before the
 36 football game seen in the film, The Dark Knight Rises.
 37 C.J. was 11 years old when he auditioned and was chosen to
 38 sing the anthem in front of a crowd of approximately
 39 10,000 extras. C.J. is a member of the Children's
 40 Festival Chorus, CFC of Pittsburgh, a professional level
 41 choral education and performance group that offers
 42 children a safe, nurturing and stimulating musical
 43 learning experience in which they can explore, grow and
 44 find comfort in themselves artistically, intellectually
 45 and socially.

1 As a student of CFC, we commend you, C.J., for
 2 your creativity, talent and professionalism in the
 3 performing arts. We recognize your dedication and
 4 commitment to developing your abilities and following your
 5 dream. You serve as an inspiration to this Council and
 6 the citizens of Allegheny County. On behalf of all of us,
 7 congratulations for making us all proud. Good work.
 8 (Applause.)
 9 C.J.: I'd like to thank my mom and dad for
 10 putting me in Children's Festival Chorus. Without that, I
 11 wouldn't have been able to try out. And I'd also like to
 12 thank the support of my sister.

 16 MR. CATANESE: Proclamation honoring Mr. Raymond
 17 L. Billotte, District Court Administrator of the 5th
 18 Judicial District of Pennsylvania, serving Allegheny
 19 County, upon the occasion of his retirement. Sponsored by
 20 Council members Finnerty, Macey, Burn, Danko, DeFazio,
 21 Drozd, Ellenbogen, Futules, Gastgeb, Green Hawkins,
 22 Heidelbaugh, Martoni, Palmiere, Rea and Robinson.
 23 MR. FINNERTY: Thank you, Mr. President. Ray,
 24 would you join us up here; and if the judges would like to
 25 come up, also. If they don't, we definitely have to have
 26 a president judge up here; Donna Jo. Well, Ray, it's with
 27 great pleasure that I stand here to honor you. You've
 28 done a tremendous job for our courts in the Administration
 29 Department. And I was reading through the proclamation,
 30 and there's nothing that you haven't done in that
 31 department. And we're going to miss you. We wish you the
 32 best too. Let me read the proclamation, and then we'll
 33 let the president judge say a few words.
 34 WHEREAS, Allegheny County and the Commonwealth
 35 of Pennsylvania, have been blessed with the visionaries of
 36 great knowledge and determination, upholding our courts as
 37 the guarantors of civil justice, social order and public
 38 safety; and
 39 WHEREAS, since 1996, Mr. Ray Billotte, District
 40 Court Administrator of the 5th Judicial District of
 41 Pennsylvania, serving Allegheny County, has overseen the
 42 administration and operation of the second largest trial
 43 court in the state, serving more than 1.2 million
 44 citizens;

1 WHEREAS, prior to his appointment as District
 2 Court Administrator, Mr. Billotte served as the Deputy
 3 Court Administrator of the 5th Judicial District of
 4 Pennsylvania. And from 1986 to 1992, Mr. Billotte served
 5 as the District Court Administrator for the 46th Judicial
 6 District of Pennsylvania, serving Clearfield County; and
 7 WHEREAS, Mr. Billotte has served internationally
 8 as a consultant for the USAID, addressing criminal justice
 9 reforms in several Mexican states, testified before the
 10 Pennsylvania Senate regarding jury reform and has served
 11 on numerous Pennsylvania Supreme Court and Pennsylvania
 12 Association of Court Management committees, addressing the
 13 use of technology in the courts, preservation and
 14 transcript of court records, professional development of
 15 court management and juror diversity; and
 16 WHEREAS, as an active member of numerous court
 17 management organizations, Mr. Billotte was elected to the
 18 National Association of Court Management, the NACM Board
 19 in 2010, as the urban court director. And he has been
 20 recognized by various agencies for his work on improving
 21 access to justice, efficiency of cooperation, jury service
 22 and court and community collaboration.
 23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Allegheny
 24 County Council does hereby honor Mr. Ray L. Billotte,
 25 District Court Administrator of the 5th Judicial District
 26 of Pennsylvania, serving Allegheny County, upon the
 27 occasion of his retirement. The citizens of Allegheny
 28 County are truly indebted to Mr. Billotte for his
 29 dedication and commitment to improving the administration
 30 of justice. And this is sponsored by all members of
 31 Allegheny County Council and presented the 28th day of
 32 August, 2012. Congratulations.
 33 (Applause.)
 34 JUDGE MCDANIEL: I didn't know Ray was that
 35 good. But I feel grateful that he was leaving. I kept
 36 asking him, what about me? So instead of talking about
 37 Ray, I'm going to talk about me. Ray has been a true
 38 inspiration to me. He's pushed me along when I wanted to
 39 stop. He has given me encouragement when I needed it.
 40 I've always had absolute confidence in him, even on those
 41 days when he's been a real pain in the neck. We have big
 42 kids back there. And I will tell you that I will miss him
 43 each and every day. I wish him the best of luck, but we
 44 are all going to miss him. So thank you.
 45 (Applause.)

1 MR. BILLOTTE: First, members of council, thank
 2 you very much. It means a lot that you all sponsored this
 3 bill and I appreciate it very much. I do want to thank
 4 the judges who have come here today. I appreciate it very
 5 much. I'm honored by your presence to be here.
 6 Retirement is kind of --- but that's not quite ---. I
 7 am --- I have decided to take another position out West.
 8 I've been here for 20 years, and I've loved every minute
 9 of it. I enjoyed Pittsburgh and Allegheny County so much.
 10 I've enjoyed working with every one of you. If I can
 11 leave, I hope, with one thing to help along in all that,
 12 on this collaboration of working together on issues that
 13 are important not only to you, as members of Council and
 14 we as people within the judiciary, but certainly, to our
 15 citizens in this county. So I very much appreciate this,
 16 and thank you very much. I'll miss everyone; so thank
 17 you.

 20 PRESIDENT MARTONI: 7116-12.
 21 MR. CATANESE: Proclamation commending the
 22 lifesaving actions of the lifeguards at Settlers Cabin
 23 Wave Pool on June 10th, 2012. Sponsored by Council
 24 members Finnerty, Drozd, Futules, Burn, Danko, DeFazio,
 25 Ellenbogen, Gastgeb, Green Hawkins, Heidelbaugh, Macey,
 26 Martoni, Palmiere, Rea and Robinson.
 27 MR. FINNERTY: Would you please join me up here,
 28 Parks Director Andy, Clarence, Anne. I forgot about the
 29 Superintendent. Is he up here? There he is. Well,
 30 again, this is a great honor for me to present these to
 31 people --- young people that have done some great things.
 32 And any time you save somebody's life, it's a great thing.
 33 And we in the county truly appreciate your efforts out at
 34 the pool. I know it's tough out there in the wave pool.
 35 And I've been there a couple times and sometimes I get a
 36 little frightened myself with those waves. But it must be
 37 a very difficult job for lifeguards at the wave pool. You
 38 have to be always on your toes and ready to jump in there
 39 and save somebody's life. We're really thankful for your
 40 efforts. With that, I'll read the proclamation.
 41 WHEREAS, Allegheny County is blessed to have
 42 employees dedicated to ensuring the health, safety and
 43 welfare of the public; and
 44 WHEREAS, on June 10th, 2012, at two p.m.,
 45 Allegheny County lifeguards pulled a 23-year-old man named

1 Thomas Leadbitter out of the deep end of Settlers Cabin's
 2 Wave Pool and found that he was unconscious, not breathing
 3 and without a pulse; and
 4 WHEREAS, upon performing CPR and using the
 5 automatic external defibrillator, AED, the lifeguards were
 6 able to retain a pulse and Mr. Leadbitter began breathing
 7 on his own. Mr. Leadbitter was transported to Allegheny
 8 General Hospital and admitted in critical condition. The
 9 following day, Mr. Leadbitter was listed in critical but
 10 stable condition and was expected to fully recover;
 11 WHEREAS, many lifeguards on duty that day
 12 contributed to the rescue effort in the form of crowd
 13 control. Approximately 4,000 people were in attendance
 14 that day at the pool, blocking the view from the general
 15 public and filling into the places the guards administered
 16 CPR were initially responsible for.
 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Allegheny
 18 County Council, on behalf of the citizens of Allegheny
 19 County, does hereby commend the heroic actions of the
 20 Allegheny County Settlers Cabin Park Wave Pool lifeguards,
 21 whose quick response and teamwork resulted in saving Mr.
 22 Thomas Leadbitter's life on July 10th, 2012. We are
 23 extremely grateful for your dedication and commitment to
 24 ensure the health, safety and welfare of the residents of
 25 Allegheny County. And this is sponsored by all members of
 26 Allegheny Council on the 28th day of August, 2012. Thank
 27 you very much.
 28 (Applause.)
 29 MR. FINNERTY: We also have individual
 30 proclamations; so Andy, if you would take over the podium.
 31 MR. BAECHLE: As you guys are aware, we run four
 32 of some of the largest swimming pools in the country, and
 33 we hire about 130 to 150 of the county's finest people.
 34 And I'm so proud; on June 10th, these folks just did their
 35 job. And they were trained to do it, and a pool might do
 36 70 to 100 rescues a year. This one was an odd one; there
 37 was some complications. But I'm so proud of these folks.
 38 And I just want to give them the attention that they have
 39 due. And we work with our partners, the county police.
 40 You know, without them our parks wouldn't operate. And
 41 they were partners with us as soon as things happened.
 42 There's always an officer at the pool, and they came and
 43 interceded. And I want to thank Jack Doyle, who's the
 44 manager of the pool, he has other jobs, he couldn't make
 45 it tonight. And I wanted to turn it over to Marie Kukero.

1 just to --- she's assistant manager. And I'd just like
 2 her to introduce the folks and say a few words. But I'll
 3 tell you, my hats off to Allegheny County's finest.
 4 MS. KUKERO: Marie Kukero. Wid like to thank
 5 everyone for doing their job. I could not run the
 6 facility without competent lifeguards like themselves up
 7 here. This is Evan Zombek; he was one of the guards
 8 there. This is Dustin Donnelly --- that's Donnelly's
 9 mother, he could not be in attendance tonight. She's here
 10 on his behalf --- Julia Gutterbaugh and Joe Gerbiak. And
 11 that's Steven down there, Zombek. He was one of the
 12 guards not initially on the scene. He was, I believe, on
 13 duty on the other side.
 14 MR. BAECHLE: There was eight other people that
 15 helped in this rescue, but we had 30 or 40 guards on duty.
 16 And they were all working to do whatever it takes.
 17 Charlie, did you want to say anything?
 18 CHARLIE: No, I'm fine.
 19 MR. BAECHLE: I want to thank everybody, and
 20 we're always looking for lifeguards. If you kids are
 21 going out to be lifeguards were looking for them. Thank
 22 you.
 23 (Applause.)

 25 PRESIDENT MARTONI: 7117-12.
 26 MR. CATANESE: Proclamation honoring Mr. and
 27 Mrs. Edward and Jane Haney, for their many contributions
 28 to the Borough of Brentwood. Sponsored by Councilman
 29 Palmiere.
 30 MR. PALMIERE: Thank you, Mr. President, and
 31 members of Council. It's a real honor for me this evening
 32 to stand up here and bring to your attention and to the
 33 county's attention, and everyone else that's
 34 interested to introduce Jane and Ed Haney. I've known
 35 them for quite a number of years, and they've made
 36 enormous contributions to the Borough of Brentwood. And
 37 they're real true humanitarians, and they really, really
 38 exemplify what public service is all about. And Mr.
 39 Haney, of course, is Ed. It's a pleasure to have you here
 40 this evening.
 41 MR. HANEY: Thank you.
 42 MR. PALMIERE: I want to read it into the
 43 record, the proclamation for Jane, here, if I may.
 44 WHEREAS, Ms. Jane T. Haney has exemplified the
 45 definition of a dedicated citizen of our great county, in

1 her demonstration of professional, civic and community
 2 leadership; and
 3 WHEREAS, Ms. Haney served on the Board of School
 4 Directors for the Brentwood Borough School District for
 5 more than 17 years; and
 6 WHEREAS, Ms. Haney also served on the Brentwood
 7 Library Board from 1959 to 2001 and Brentwood Friends of
 8 the Library, Brentwood Boosters and Brentwood Grandparents
 9 and Brentwood Neighborhood Girl Scouts, from 1959 to 2001,
 10 the Brentwood 4th of July Committee, Brentwood 5k Race
 11 Committee, was Chair of the Brentwood House Tour and the
 12 President of the Brentwood Country Club. Other than that,
 13 she wasn't doing anything.
 14 WHEREAS, as a member of the Goodwill of
 15 Southwestern Pennsylvania Board, from 1998 to 2010, and as
 16 a member of the Jefferson Regional Hospital Auxiliary from
 17 2003 to the present, Ms. Haney has demonstrated
 18 exceptional community service.
 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Allegheny
 20 County Council, on behalf of the citizens of Allegheny
 21 County, hereby commends Ms. Jane T. Haney for being
 22 distinguished and one of our great public servants. We
 23 thank her for her incredible career of dedication, which
 24 has undoubtedly bettered the Borough of Brentwood and
 25 Allegheny County. And we wish her the best in all of her
 26 future endeavors. Sponsored by myself and I'm sure the
 27 rest of members of Council congratulate you.
 28 (Applause.)
 29 MR. PALMIERE: Okay. Now, we're going to get to
 30 the Mister here.
 31 WHEREAS, Mr. Edward J. Haney has exemplified the
 32 definition of dedicated citizen in our great county, for
 33 his demonstration of professional, civic and community
 34 leadership; and
 35 WHEREAS, he was a Brentwood Borough council
 36 member for 17 years Mr. Haney served as a borough
 37 representative for the Brentwood Library Board, as a
 38 member of the Brentwood Planning Commission; and
 39 WHEREAS, Mr. Haney had the distinct pleasure of
 40 serving as President of the Allegheny County Boroughs
 41 Association and as a member of the Pennsylvania State
 42 Association of Boroughs;
 43 WHEREAS, as an active member of the community,
 44 Mr. Haney served as a Commissioner and President of the
 45 Brentwood Athletic Association, from 1961 to 1971, as a

1 MR. ROBINSON: Mr. President?
 2 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Yes.
 3 MR. ROBINSON: Thank you, Mr. President, and
 4 members of Council. I just would like to follow up on a
 5 presentation that I made last Tuesday. I definitely will
 6 be briefer today because there's less to share with you.
 7 But there is a tentative schedule for our budget
 8 deliberations which all members should have in their
 9 possession. And I believe the date is August 15th, 2012
 10 on that document. As I have done in the past years, I'd
 11 like to submit this to the budget schedule to be entered
 12 into the record, with the understanding that, to date, Mr.
 13 Szymanski and I have not received any suggested changes to
 14 the tentative budget schedule. But we anticipate that
 15 might be the case in the future. So I'd just like to have
 16 this submitted as part of the official record. And our
 17 stenographer, she already has a copy. Thank you, Mr.
 18 President, and members of Council.
 19 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Thank you. Liaison reports:
 20 any reports? Bob?
 21 MR. MACEY: Thank you, Mr. President, and
 22 members of Council. I would just like to share with the
 23 residents of Allegheny County and those counties adjacent
 24 to us, a few things that are going on in Mon Valley.
 25 First of all, on September 8, West Mifflin will have its
 26 Community Days. That will be at the Allegheny County
 27 Airport from 12 to 7, with fireworks after that; a lot of
 28 good food, games and fun. In addition to that, on
 29 September 15th, there will be Duquesne Appreciation Day.
 30 Similar situation; the only thing is, it's 1:30 p.m. until
 31 dusk, where there will be fireworks. It's being held at
 32 the Polish Hill at the top of Grant Avenue in Duquesne.
 33 We have one other event. It's called Tour de
 34 Mon. It's sponsored by the Mon Yough Area Chamber of
 35 Commerce. It is a family and individual fun bike ride on
 36 the Steel Valley Trail. It begins at the Historic Pump
 37 House in Munhall at the old Homestead Works, and it will
 38 return. Adults it's \$20 and those under 18, it's \$10.
 39 It's a lot of fun. Get out there on the Allegheny Passage
 40 Trail and have fun. Thank you.
 41 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Vince, go ahead.
 42 MR. GASTGEB: Thank you, President Martoni.
 43 Just real quick I wanted to mention, that this weekend in
 44 South Park there's going to be the Rib and Wing Challenge.
 45 It will be free obviously and some live bands. I believe

1 member of Brentwood Grandparents, Brentwood Boosters and

 40 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Presentation of
 41 Appointments.
 42 MR. CATANESE: I have none.
 43 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Unfinished Business.
 44 MR. CATANESE: I have none.
 45 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Okay. Liaison Reports.

1 that's on the master, but we're going to have it anyhow.
 2 I did want to pay thanks to Andy Baechle, since he's here,
 3 in the Parks Department. This is a large event to have.
 4 It was also a large event in July at the county
 5 fairgrounds. It was another non-profit group putting on a
 6 car show with food and bands and I believe this weekend
 7 there's national bands coming. There's a lot going on at
 8 the fairgrounds. A lot of this can't be done if Andy and
 9 Joe Olezak don't get together and work real closely with

 18 Sponsored by the Chief Executive.
 19 PRESIDENT MARTONI: That goes to committee on
 20 Parks. New Business, Motions.
 21 MR. GASTGEB: Mr. President, if I could have New
 22 Business-Ordinances, still?
 23 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Okay.
 24 MR. GASTGEB: I'd like to make a motion to take
 25 from table of last week. Ordinance Number 7109-12.
 26 MR. FINNERTY: Second.
 27 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Moved and second. Question?
 28 And that would be a roll call; right? Roll call.
 29 MR. CATANESE: Mr. Burn?

1 MS. GREEN HAWKINS: Aye.
 2 MR. CATANESE: Ms. Heidelbaugh?
 3 MS. HEIDELBAUGH: Yes.
 4 MR. CATANESE: Mr. Macey?
 5 MR. MACEY: Yes.
 6 MR. CATANESE: Mr. Palmiere?
 7 MR. PALMIERE: Yes.
 8 MR. CATANESE: Ms. Rea?
 9 (No response.)
 10 MR. CATANESE: Mr. Robinson?
 11 MR. ROBINSON: Aye.
 12 MR. CATANESE: Mr. Martoni, President?
 13 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Yes.
 14 MR. CATANESE: Ayes, 13, noes, 0. It passes.
 15 PRESIDENT MARTONI: That will go to the Parks
 16 Committee; am I correct?
 17 MR. FINNERTY: That's correct.
 18 MR. GASTGEB: President Martoni, if I could
 19 offer an amendment to 7109-12 at this time?
 20 MR. FINNERTY: No, you can't. It was sent for a
 21 committee.
 22 MR. GASTGEB: Okay. Ill offer it in committee.
 23 MR. BURN: You can offer it in committee.
 24 MR. GASTGEB: Actually, its just an attachment.
 25 It's not even an amendment. It just attaches to the
 26 master plan.
 27 PRESIDENT MARTONI: That goes to the Parks
 28 Committee. Okay. Notification of Contracts.
 29 MR. CATANESE: I have none.
 30 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Public Comment on General
 31 Items.
 32 MR. CATANESE: We have three.
 33 PRESIDENT MARTONI: We have three speakers. The
 34 first speaker is Harry Liller.
 35 MR. LILLER: My name's Harry Liller, 438 Ruxton
 36 Street, Pittsburgh, PA, 15211. Since Councilman
 37 Ellenbogen would not bring out the civilian police review
 38 board out of committee -- what are you going to do, just
 39 sit on it for months? He says its a black and white
 40 issue, a racist issue. I would say no. I would say
 41 police have to be accountable and responsible for the
 42 things they do. In the Jonny Gammage case, it was
 43 suburban policemen beating him to death, so they have to
 44 be responsible. We have terrible, stupid ignorant
 45 district attorneys, who have my phone illegally

1 wiretapped, protecting corrupt police, corrupt judges,
 2 corrupt constables. And the media always leaves because
 3 they do not want to be responsible, either.
 4 My sister was brutalized and given death
 5 threats. She was part of the lawsuit but the media would
 6 never tell the public. In fact, when the ACLU lawsuit was
 7 finished, the Post-Gazette deliberately lied. They said
 8 the police won four of the five cases. What a big lie.
 9 The police lost four of the six cases. Why can't we have
 10 responsibility? Why can't Ellenbogen answer for it? But
 11 guess what he does? He's in Public Safety. He wants to
 12 name a bridge after Art Rooney. Art Rooney's FBI file
 13 says he's a criminal hanging out with gangsters in New
 14 Kensington in 1946. I didn't make this up. When you're
 15 in a mafia, your soul does not go to heaven. Why are we
 16 hero worshipping gangsters and protecting corrupt police?
 17 I heard Mr. Ellenbogen had a hissy fit because
 18 his hero wasn't brought back up as Council president. If
 19 he were listening last week, I kind of told you all how
 20 corrupt this county really was. And you all had the
 21 chance to verify and talk with me about it; but no. I
 22 tell the truth. You all protect the corruption. Here's
 23 another thing that happened when his hero was Council
 24 president. We have a thing called overnight booking
 25 centers where the Council president, the county sheriff
 26 padded the budget. So he was able to get out bonuses to
 27 all his officers and they, in return, gave him a
 28 kickback --- pay back, kickbacks --- stealing county
 29 taxpayers' money. And they get away with it.
 30 It's amazing the crap that goes on and all the
 31 time. So bring it out of committee. You're all going to
 32 vote it down because there's only two blacks. But let the
 33 public vote on it. Almost 60 percent of the people of
 34 Pittsburgh voted for it. Put it on the ballot, because if
 35 you don't, I'm going to go to every black church in this
 36 county and they're going to cheer me on with signatures,
 37 and we're going to kick your butt on the elections. And
 38 we're going to kick your butt on judgment day.
 39 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Thank you. Dr. Ron Miller,
 40 DR. MILLER: Dr. Ronald Lynn Miller, 40
 41 Beltzhoover Road, in Pittsburgh, 412-381-3753. I'm the
 42 founder and director of Pennsylvania Democratization
 43 Initiative. It has grown out of the Pittsburgh
 44 Democratization Initiative, which I established in 2010.
 45 PDI efforts in the City of Pittsburgh have led to a

1 troubling conclusion. The residents of the nine-city
 2 councilor districts recognize their council member not
 3 more than ten percent of the time. Ninety (90) percent of
 4 the adult individuals in City Council districts do not
 5 know who serves them as councilors. PDI activities in the
 6 County of Allegheny and outside of Pittsburgh have led to
 7 a similar troubling conclusion. The residents of the 13-
 8 county councilor districts recognize their council member
 9 not more than ten percent of the time. Ninety (90)
 10 percent of your adult population in County Council
 11 districts do not know you as their councilors. I and the
 12 PDI view this pattern at the city and county levels to be
 13 inimitable to our U.S. democracy. You are overwhelmingly
 14 unknown. Therefore, holding you responsible for Council
 15 actions for Allegheny is highly improbable and extremely
 16 difficult. You are elected and act in almost total
 17 obscurity
 18 Asked in PDI surveys, do you think city and
 19 county districts are artificially drawn, 90 percent of the
 20 respondents say yes. Asked, do you think that a city
 21 district drawn to correspond to your neighborhood would be
 22 better less artificial, over 90 percent of Pittsburgh city
 23 adults say yes. Asked, do you think that a county
 24 district corresponding to your municipality would be
 25 better, over 90 percent of Allegheny County adults,
 26 outside and inside Pittsburgh, say yes. The PDI asked
 27 survey participants to assume City Council members could
 28 be taken from city districts corresponding to their
 29 neighborhoods and County Council members from county
 30 districts corresponding to their municipalities. The PDI
 31 then asked, do you believe that your Council member would
 32 represent you more fairly than now, that your willingness
 33 to participate in City Council and County Council matters
 34 would go up, the answer is yes.
 35 The conclusion. The present City and County
 36 Council district frameworks should be scrapped. City
 37 Council districts should be neighborhood based. County
 38 Council districts should be the municipalities.
 39 Pittsburgh City Council would be enlarged to a minimum of
 40 20 members. And of course, Allegheny County Council would
 41 be very large at 132 members.
 42 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Thank you, Jim Barr? Jim,
 43 before you start, could you give us your address? We
 44 don't have it on the record.

1 MR. BARR: Jim Barr, 200 Frankfort Avenue, West
 2 View Borough. I wanted to thank President Martoni and Joe
 3 Catanese for allowing me to speak tonight. I just found
 4 out about this meeting about --- less than an hour ago, so
 5 I didn't prepare well. But I do have a very urgent
 6 message that I wanted to plead with these Council members
 7 about. I'd like you to contact your U.S. senators, Pat
 8 Toomey and Bob Casey, urging them to audit the Federal
 9 Reserve. I have a fax already prepared. I'd like to read
 10 it for you. I strongly urge you to support a stand-alone
 11 vote and audit the Federal Reserve and to reject any
 12 attempt to water down the bill. I cannot impress upon you
 13 enough the importance of educating the American people
 14 about the destructive path that the federal reserve is
 15 leading our country toward financial ruin. If you would
 16 please send this to our U.S. senators --- it already
 17 passed the House. This is something that the American
 18 people don't know about. These people are operating
 19 without being exposed of what they're doing to us. I
 20 believe something very, very bad is going to happen to
 21 this country. And that's why I'm here tonight. I can
 22 only urge you to do that, and I would plead with you to do
 23 that. Thank you very much.

24 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Thank you.
 25 MR. BARR: I have copies if you would like a
 26 copy to fax or to send.
 27 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Give it to Joe. He'll
 28 address it. Thank you, again. Motion for adjournment?
 29 MR. MACEY: I make a motion to adjourn.
 30 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Moved AND second. Question?
 31 All in favor?
 32 (Chorus of ayes.)
 33 PRESIDENT MARTONI: Opposed? So ordered.
