## Services and supports offered as part of the Allegheny County Jail Collaborative

### **Drug and alcohol services may include but are not limited to:**

#### Inpatient services and treatment may include

- Family counseling in both individual and group modalities;
- Self-help support groups;
- Clinically supervised group and individual therapy;
- Psychological and medical testing as indicated;
- Counseling in recreation, spirituality, diet and exercise;
- Medically supervised withdrawal from alcohol and other drugs;
- Introduction to recovery treatment through interventions, testing as required;
- Introduction to AA or NA and AA and/or NA lectures;
- Psychological and medical testing as indicated;
- Counseling in recreation, spirituality, diet and exercise;
- Life skills;
- Referrals for physical health services;
- Education supports (GED)

#### Outpatient services and treatment may include

- Individual, group and family counseling;
- Methadone clinics;
- Psychotherapy;
- Counseling;
- Psychiatric evaluation and referrals;
- Temporary medication for treatment of physiological conditions or as an adjunct to psychosocial treatment;
- 12-step programs;
- Adult Children of Alcoholics; and
- DUI programs.

**Employment and Training services may include but are not limited to:**

- Skills assessment
- Resume and interviewing tips;

- Additional education and training (GED preparatory classes, assistance in applying for vocational/higher education, researching and applying for financial aid alternatives.)

**Hunger and housing assistance may include but is not limited to:**

Housing counseling including

- Reviewing housing situation
- Providing education and information concerning
  - Home maintenance,
  - Financial management, and
  - Budgeting.
- Referrals to a network of area service providers.
- Options for homeless families and individuals ranging from area shelters and transitional housing, to various forms of subsidized and rental housing.

Hunger services including

- Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFA)
  - Referred to one of over 300 pantries in the network.
  - If need is urgent, food is provided from an onsite pantry along with food vouchers.
- Food Stamp Outreach and Enrollment Program (FSOE)
