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Fitzgerald Submits Bills to Council for Consideration at November 17 Meeting

PITTSBURGH – County Executive Rich Fitzgerald submitted eight bills to County Council for consideration at its upcoming Tuesday, November 17th meeting:

- Ordinance establishing rules, regulations and rates relating to the conduct of certain activities held on and about the Courthouse Grand Staircase, Gallery and Courtyard and the County Office Building lobby.
- Resolution amending the 2009 Capital Budget to remove funding for a project entitled “Bull Creek Restoration” and add funding for a new project entitled “Sheriff’s Office Improvement Projects.” The work on Bull Creek was recently completed and the funding in the 2009 Capital Budget was not used.
- Resolution amending the 2010 Capital Budget to remove funding for a project entitled “Bull Creek Stream Bank Restoration” and add funding for a new project entitled “Sheriff’s Office Improvement Projects.” The work on Bull Creek was recently completed and the funding in the 2010 Capital Budget was not used.

- Resolution amending the 2014 Capital Budget to remove funding for a project entitled “North Park Barn Restoration” and add funding for a new project entitled “Parks Utility Metering Project.” It was determined after the adoption of the 2014 budget that the barn could not be restored and, ultimately, the barn had to be demolished.
- Resolution agreeing to participate in a Transit Revitalization Investment District (TRID) Plan for Phase II of the East Liberty Project and authorizing related agreements. The proposed Phase II TRID Plan will allow for a diversion of real estate tax increment to pay for a portion of the proposed public infrastructure projects. The county, along with the city and school district will dedicate 70% of its increased real estate tax revenues from the designated parcels that comprise the eight designated subprojects. The development cost of these projects is estimated to be \$220

million and the increment generated from these projects will fund about \$12.3 million in public infrastructure including six infrastructure projects: 1) Larimer transit station; 2) Homewood/Larimer bikeway connection; 3) Lincoln School pedestrian infrastructure; 4) Larimer improvements; 5) affordable housing; and, 6) way finding, pedestrian, public space, and street grid improvements.

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
