Fitzgerald Submits Eight Bills, Three Reappointments for October 9 Meeting *2019 Comprehensive Fiscal Plan & Budget Address to be Presented to Council*

PITTSBURGH – County Executive Rich Fitzgerald has submitted three bills to County Council for its consideration or referral to committee at its next meeting, Tuesday, October 9:

- Ordinance authorizing the county to acquire right-of-way and temporary construction easements from 11 parcels required to reconstruct Kenmawr Bridge carrying Kenmawr Avenue/South Braddock Avenue over Norfolk Southern Railway in Rankin and Swissvale Boroughs. The parcels include a mix of property owners who cannot be located, or property owners who have not accepted the presented offers for the necessary property interests. Pursuant to the Administrative Code, the estimated just compensation will be deposited with Court Records to secure possession of the property for the project;
- Ordinance authorizing the Northern Allegheny County Senior Softball League to use certain property in North Park for the purposes of conducting softball activities. The authorization begins on September 15, 2018 and continues through September 14, 2021, with an option to extend the authorization through September 14, 2023 at the sole discretion of the county;
- Ordinance authorizing the county to provide additional security for 2018 new lease revenue bonds to be issued by the county Industrial Development Authority by providing a guaranty to replenish any deficiency in the Debt Service Reserve Fund in the event that its affiliated corporations fail to do so; the obligation under the new guarantee shall not exceed \$2.6 million over the term of the 2018 bonds;
- Ordinance authorizing the county to donate certain rights-of-way and easements to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation as required for two bridge projects;
- Ordinance authorizing Gravitational Productions LLC to use certain county-owned real property situated in and around Hartwood Acres Park, including the stables, in connection with filming a motion picture tentatively titled "Pickle." Filming would occur on or about October 29, 2018 through December 22, 2018;
- Ordinance authorizing the county to acquire right-of-way and easement areas from a parcel required to stabilize the slope area above Worthington Avenue and below Gilmore Drive in Jefferson Hills Borough. Some heirs to the parcel have been located, but others have not been identified, necessitating this process. Pursuant to the Administrative Code, the estimated just compensation will be deposited with Court Records to secure possession of the property for the project;
- Ordinance authorizing the Allegheny County Parks Foundation to use certain property in Boyce Park as a management office. The authorization begins on October 1, 2018 and continues through September 30, 2021, with an option to extend the authorization through September 30, 2023 at the sole discretion of the county;
- Resolution amending the 2018 Grants and Special Accounts Budget to accept a new grant of \$324,000 from the Corporation for National and Community Service – Choose Home for Human Services to provide additional support to select veterans 65 and over and their

caregivers by assigning them an experienced volunteer who will conduct one-on-one visits in their home up to two times per week.

Additionally, County Executive Fitzgerald submitted three reappointments to County Council for its consideration and approval:

- Helen Cahalane, Ph.D., ACSW, LCSW – Children, Youth & Families Advisory Board
- Mary M. Carrasco, MD, MPH, FAAP – Children, Youth & Families Advisory Board
- Rhonda Marlene Harrison, Ed.D. – Children, Youth & Families Advisory Board

Pursuant to Section 5-801.04 of the county's Administrative Code, the County Executive will present the 2019 Comprehensive Fiscal Plan and budget address at the October 9, 2018 meeting.

Finally, County Manager William D. McKain CPA announced that Angelia G. Adediran, CPM, CFE, M.DIV. has joined Human Services as the Executive Deputy Director of Administration. Deputy Director Adediran previously held the position of Deputy Director for more than 10 years in the City of Richmond's executive leadership with departments such as Social Services, Office of Minority Business, and the Office of Minority Health. She also served as the appointed County Administrator of Charles City County, Virginia for more than five years, and as Budget Director for the City of Chesapeake for two years. She is a graduate of University of Virginia Sorensen Institute for Political Leaders Program. She earned her Master of Divinity from Virginia Union University and bachelor's degree in Business Administration-Management from Virginia State University. She assumed the Executive Deputy Director position on September 17, 2018.
