 40 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10030-17.
 41 MR. BARKER: Proclamation declaring the month of
 42 February as "Black History Month" in Allegheny County.
 43 Sponsored by Council Members Walton, Baker, Catena,
 44 DeFazio, DeMarco, Ellenbogen, Futules, Kirk, Klein, Kress,
 45 Macey, Martoni, Means, Palmiere and Ranalli-Russell.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the
 2 Allegheny County Council does hereby proclaim the month of
 3 February as Black History Month in Allegheny County. We
 4 call upon all the people of Allegheny County to observe
 5 this month with appropriate programs, ceremonies and
 6 activities that highlight and honor the contributions
 7 African-Americans have made to our county and our nation.
 8 Sponsored by myself and my fellow colleagues of
 9 council, and signed by President John P. DeFazio,
 10 President of Council. Thank you. And Sylvia, do you have
 11 a comment? You're never short of one.
 12 MS. WILSON: Well, as a teacher, retired now, we
 13 must say that even though it has expanded from a week to a
 14 month, what we try to do in school through education is to
 15 not just have a segment of time dedicated to the work that
 16 has been done in the past. And as we move forward in the
 17 future, to recognize the accomplishments that so many
 18 African-Americans have made in this country be all year
 19 round, not just something that we embrace just in this
 20 short period of time.
 21 So I appreciate the acknowledgement that all of
 22 you have done. And of course, you know, I know most of
 23 you and all the work that you've continued doing. And I
 24 appreciate it. And thank you, DeWitt.
 25 MR. WALTON: Thank you.
 26 MS. WILSON: And I apologize. I'm running to
 27 another meeting.
 28 MR. WALTON: And let me close by saying this.
 29 Not only is Sylvia my buddy, she's also my boss. Sylvia
 30 is president of the Pittsburgh chapter of the A. Philip
 31 Randolph Institute. It was founded in 1965 by Asa Philip
 32 Randolph, designed to empower the working poor, middle
 33 class and minorities across this country, to bring about
 34 the awareness and build power in the Black Labor Alliance.
 35 And Sylvia has provided leadership for the past dozen
 36 years to that chapter, and she's an incredible ally and a
 37 great leader in our community. Thanks for being my friend
 38 and my boss, baby. Can I get a raise?
 39 (Applause.)

 41 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10031-17.
 42 MR. BARKER: Proclamation congratulating the
 43 Allegheny County Airport Authority upon the occasion of
 44 the Pittsburgh International Airport being named the 2017
 45 Airport of the Year by Air Transport World Magazine.

1 MR. WALTON: I'm going to have my colleague,
 2 Sylvia Wilson, who is director of the Pittsburgh Public
 3 Schools, the Chairman of the Board of ALCOSAN, come with
 4 me as we deliver this proclamation. She is my buddy, my
 5 ally, my long-term friend.
 6 MS. WILSON: And the strength makes ---.
 7 MR. WALTON: Absolutely. And you know, I think
 8 that Black History Month has so much significance to
 9 America, to our community. And we talk about the
 10 contributions that have been generated previously, even
 11 when African-Americans couldn't control patents in this
 12 country. They could make inventions, but they couldn't
 13 hold the patent rights. And so how far we've come, but
 14 how far yet we have to travel to make America live up to
 15 the goals, and dreams, and aspirations of my forefathers
 16 --- my forefathers and Sylvia's as well.
 17 WHEREAS, as a Harvard-trained historian, Dr.
 18 Carter G. Woodson, like W.E.B. Du Bois before him,
 19 believed that truth could not be denied and that reason
 20 would prevail over justice, his hopes to raise awareness
 21 of African-American's contributions to civilization was
 22 realized when he and the organization he founded, the
 23 Association for the Study of Negro Life and History,
 24 conceived and announced Negro History Week in 1925. The
 25 event was first celebrated during a week in 19 ---
 26 February 1926 that encompassed the birthdays of both
 27 Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, two key figures in
 28 the history of African-Americans; and
 29 WHEREAS, the Black awakening of the 1960s
 30 dramatically expanded the consciousness of
 31 African-Americans about the importance of black history,
 32 and the Civil Rights movement focused Americans of all
 33 colors on the subject of the contributions of
 34 African-Americans to our history and culture; and
 35 WHEREAS, the celebrations was expanded to a
 36 month in 1976, and President Gerald R. Ford urged
 37 Americans to seize the opportunity to honor the too-often
 38 neglected accomplishments of Black Americans in every
 39 field of human --- of every field of endeavor throughout
 40 our history; and
 41 WHEREAS, during this month, we honor
 42 African-Americans who have placed their stamp of character
 43 on Allegheny County and we recognize their essential role
 44 in shaping the story of our country and region through
 45 their many accomplishments and contributions;

1 Sponsored by Council Members Baker, Catena, DeFazio,
 2 DeMarco, Ellenbogen, Futules, Kirk, Klein, Kress, Macey,
 3 Martoni, Means, Palmiere, Ranalli-Russell and Walton.
 4 MR. BAKER: All right. Thank you, Mr.
 5 President. Councilman --- Councilman Gastgeb already has
 6 come up, which is good. We've got our CEO of the
 7 Allegheny County Airport, Christina Cassotis, here.
 8 Congratulations, first of all, the best airport, not just
 9 in America but in the world, which is amazing. So
 10 congratulations.
 11 (Applause.)
 12 MR. BAKER: And huge news, the first time that a
 13 city in America has won. Previous winners included Hong
 14 Kong, London and Singapore, so this is the first time that
 15 it's happening in our country, which is pretty incredible.
 16 meeting that I
 17 Pittsburgh.
 18 Pittsburgh, or at
 19 at the press
 20 I will say that Councilman Macey looks the same.
 21 Former Councilman Rea looks the same. I look kind of the
 22 same. And the airport looks very different right now in a
 23 very, very positive way because there are so many more
 24 flights coming in and going out of our airport. And that
 25 is in great part due to Christina's leadership. We're
 26 very lucky. This body is, of course, unfortunate to have
 27 lost Councilman Gastgeb, but he's doing a great job as the
 28 the
 29 Christina. And I feel really proud to get to represent
 30 the airport in this time of growth where so many things
 31 are going on well. So I'm going to share the quick
 32 proclamation and then we'll hear some words from Christina
 33 Christina
 34 WHEREAS, Air Transport --- or Air Transport
 35 World magazine, a longtime respected industry resource,
 36 has named Pittsburgh International Airport as its 2017
 37 Airport of the Year citing its rapid ascent into air
 38 service gains as well as increased community engagement;
 39 and
 40 WHEREAS, Pittsburgh International is the first
 41 U.S. airport to be added to the magazine's distinguished
 42 honoree list that also includes Hong Kong, London and
 43 Singapore; and

1 WHEREAS, Pittsburgh International serves 68
 2 nonstop destinations, a 75-percent increase over the 37
 3 destinations available in 2014. And again, I showed you
 4 the picture. She started in 2014. The airport has seen
 5 multiple new carriers enter the market, and the airport
 6 finished 2016, its busiest year since 2008, with more than
 7 8.3 million passengers, posting a third straight year of
 8 gains after more than a decade of decline. The airport
 9 and its Board have also spearheaded a community coalition
 10 to support their service that includes businesses and
 11 tourism organizations, elected officials at the county,
 12 state and local levels, foundations, and colleges and
 13 universities, and
 14 WHEREAS, Pittsburgh International Airport will
 15 be featured in the next issue of Air Transport World
 16 magazine and will be formally honored at ATW's 43rd Annual
 17 will be
 18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Allegheny
 19 County Council does hereby congratulate the Allegheny
 20 County Airport Authority upon the occasion of Air
 21 Transport World magazine designating the Pittsburgh
 22 International Airport as its 2017 Airport of the Year, and
 23 we commend your dedication to excellence, making
 24 Pittsburgh International Airport one of the best airports
 25 in the world. Sponsored by myself and passed by all of
 26 council. Congratulations.
 27 (Applause.)
 28 MS. CASSOTIS: Well, I'm flattered and I'm
 29 confident that you were as surprised as we were when we
 30 got the award. We've got a lot of work behind us and a
 31 lot more to do. And I can tell you that the reason it
 32 works is because all of our community partnerships, and
 33 all of the work that were supported not only at Pittsburgh
 34 International Airport, but at Allegheny County Airport, as
 35 well, which is a key part of our system.
 36 So thank you for being our councilman and for
 37 being at my press conference and welcoming me to
 38 Pittsburgh. It's been two short years, but we hope to
 39 have a lot more success in the future and a lot more for
 40 everybody to be proud of here in Pittsburgh. So Vince, as
 41 a former County Councilman and our head of Corporate and
 42 Community Affairs, has been fantastic and has been a great
 43 partner with me personally in getting me introduced into

1 DeFazio, DeMarco, Ellenbogen, Kirk, Klein, Macey, Martoni
 2 and Palmiere.
 3 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 4 MS. MEANS: Well, I am just --- we, or
 5 Councilman John Palmiere --- sorry, senior moment there.
 6 We are so excited to be here. All of County Council is so
 7 excited to be here today. And it's our honor and our
 8 privilege to recognize the accomplishment of the Montour
 9 Trail Council and to congratulate them on being the
 10 Pennsylvania 2017 Trail of the Year. And we are
 11 privileged to have with us today members of the Trail
 12 Council, and they are President Ned Williams, Peter Kohnke
 13 --- did I say it right?
 14 MR. KOHNKE: (Indicates yes.)
 15 MS. MEANS: Don Thobaben, right?
 16 MR. THOBABEN: Yes.
 17 MS. MEANS: Dave Wright and Dave Borrebach,
 18 right?
 19 MR. BORREBACH: (Indicates yes.)
 20 MS. MEANS: All right. All right. The Trail
 21 --- the Trail Council is a shining example of what makes
 22 America great, volunteerism. We are so thankful to these
 23 individuals and other individuals, who had a vision to
 24 transform an old trail line into a recreational jewel to
 25 benefit us all, and just it's all staffed by volunteers.
 26 So volunteers work --- they put the work in, they find the
 27 land, they raise money, they do whatever it takes. They
 28 even have a volunteer answering the phones. And recently,
 29 there was a storm and six trees fell down on the trail.
 30 So who cleans it up? The volunteers.
 31 So it's just a --- and it also ties in with our
 32 healthy Allegheny. Exercise is good for us. If you feel
 33 a little down from the winter, go outside, get some
 34 sunshine and some vitamin D, right? So it's a --- we're
 35 just so really excited to be here with them today.
 36 And I'm going to read the proclamation, but
 37 first I wanted to say the Montour Trail is the nation's
 38 longest suburban trail rail, or rail trail. Provides
 39 easy, accessible, high quality outdoor recreational
 40 opportunities to hundreds of thousands of Allegheny County
 41 residents, and it's a testament to over 100,000 hours of
 42 dedication by hundreds of leaders and volunteers,
 43 accompanied by strong community partnership.
 44 And if you want to help, there's work parties
 45 that meet each month at nine --- on the first Saturday of

1 the community and has been critical to the success. So
 2 thank you very much. And I appreciate it.
 3 (Applause.)
 4 MR. GASTGEB: I was never at this podium. I was
 5 over where Councilman Kress used to sit, but it's great to
 6 Member DeFazio, I'm going to change this from 3 minutes to
 7 to
 8 guess. Do I have to ask for a privilege, Jim? I don't
 9 know.
 10 Actually, Christina has been wonderful. Two
 11 years, in some regards it's going quick, in others, it's
 12 going slow. But what a fantastic leader we have in our
 13 community, and you're seeing results because of her
 14 leadership. There's no doubt about it. But also, what
 15 she's instilled upon us --- and this is what you help us
 16 with --- you know, we are an airport. And you see the
 17 facility as, you know, the building, and there's been
 18 improvements here. But we're more than just brick and
 19 mortar. We're more than just a runway. We are a
 20 reflection of our community. So it's the civic groups,
 21 the business groups, the unions, the county level, the
 22 state level, the federal level. We've engaged the whole
 23 community, and I think that's what reflects best upon us
 24 as an airport. And I think airlines see that. They see
 25 the economy. They see us carrying that message.
 26 Certainly, Council Member Baker and DeMarco and
 27 DeFazio are right there for us. I really rely on Tom a
 28 lot, being the representative, and that's how it works.
 29 So thank you for what you do. If you're ever out and
 30 don't know as much about the airport as you should, then
 31 that's my fault. I want you know about the airport and
 32 continue to be a team member. Thank you.
 33 (Applause.)

 37 MR. BARKER: I'm sorry. 10032, the Montour
 38 Trail Council?
 39 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah.
 40 MR. BARKER: Okay. Proclamation congratulating
 41 the Montour Trail Council upon the occasion of the Montour
 42 Trail being named the 2017 Trail of the Year by the
 43 Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural
 44 Resources. Sponsored by Council Member Means, Catena,

1 each month at 9:30 at the water waste (sic) plant parking
 2 lot, at the Piney Fork, South Park --- in South Park
 3 Township. Next work one is March the 4th, so I want to
 4 see everybody there, so ---
 5 WHEREAS, Allegheny County's wealth of trails
 6 provides an abundance of opportunities for residents and
 7 visitors to enjoy our county's spectacular natural
 8 resources; and
 9 WHEREAS, the Montour Trail, stretching from
 10 Coraopolis on the Ohio River to Clairton on the
 11 Monongahela River, is one of the largest, most (sic)
 12 motorized suburban rail trails in the nation; and
 13 WHEREAS, the Montour Trail crosses the Panhandle
 14 Trail near McDonald, contains several branches and
 15 connectors including a bikeway to Pittsburgh International
 16 Airport, and the Great Allegheny Passage, which stretches
 17 more than 330 miles from Pittsburgh to Washington, D.C.,
 18 and
 19 WHEREAS, in 1989, the Montour Trail Council, an
 20 all-volunteer organization, was established to oversee the
 21 construction, maintenance and operation of a 63-mile
 22 Montour Trail with over 400,000 annual users. And the
 23 Montour Trail Council relies on volunteers, friends'
 24 groups and community organizations to keep the trail in
 25 excellent condition; and
 26 WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Department of
 27 Conservation and Natural Resources, the DCNR, has selected
 28 the Montour Trail as its 2017 Trail of the Year based on
 29 quality, benefits to the region, a strong volunteer
 30 network and a multitude of partnerships. Along with
 31 statewide recognition, the award brings with it a \$10,000
 32 mini-grant to support the public use of the trail.
 33 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Allegheny
 34 County Council does hereby congratulate the Montour Trail
 35 Council upon the occasion of the Montour Trail being named
 36 the 2017 Trail of the Year by the Pennsylvania Department
 37 of Conservation and Natural Resources. And we thank the
 38 hundreds of dedicated volunteers who contributed tens of
 39 thousands of hours over the course of the Montour Trail
 40 Council's 28-year history, helping Pennsylvania emerge as
 41 a national leader in the rail trail concept. Sponsored
 42 this day by myself, Sue Means, and all the members of
 43 County Council. Congratulations.
 44 (Applause.)

1 MS MEANS: I got a little --- John, would you
 2 like to say a few words?
 3 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Sure
 4 MR. WILLIAMS: Please, John
 5 MR. PALMIERE: Thank you. I just wanted to
 6 mention I had Sue read this because I left my glasses
 7 downstairs. And even though I walked up here and I'm on
 8 the Montour Trail a lot, I didn't want to go all the way
 9 back down and up again. So I want to congratulate
 10 everybody, Ned and the whole crew. They do a wonderful
 11 job.
 12 And anybody that's had an opportunity to use
 13 this trail --- and come out some time, come out to South
 14 Park, or out to the viaduct --- it's about to be done
 15 pretty soon, I think. And you come out there and I'll
 16 tell you what. It's just a wonderful experience. These
 17 people do a wonderful job.
 18 And one other thing I wanted to say, they do all
 19 their work on Saturdays. So I'm a barber, and there's no
 20 perfect excuse, so I don't have to go help on Saturday.
 21 But if they ever do it on Sunday or another weekday, I'll
 22 be more than happy to be there. So congratulations,
 23 gentlemen. It's good to have you here. Ned,
 24 congratulations.
 25 (Applause)
 26 MR. WILLIAMS: Say something? okay. Ladies and
 27 gentlemen, almost three decades ago when the trail started
 28 to look like maybe a possibility, Allegheny County stepped
 29 up, acquired the right-of-way and forged a partnership
 30 with a band of volunteers, some of whom are here this
 31 evening, actually. And you know, got it --- got it
 32 started. And those volunteers rolled up their sleeves,
 33 they got to work, they started building a trail.
 34 But most importantly, they, in turn, formed
 35 relationships with municipalities, with agencies, with
 36 other groups, with large alliances like the Allegheny
 37 Trail Alliance that operates the trail all the way to ---
 38 from here to Washington, DC. And most importantly, with
 39 their friends and neighbors, and got them to come out and
 40 volunteer, too, so that we can keep the thing going.
 41 So 30 years later, you know, the thing is almost
 42 done. We're still working on some sections in Coraopolis,
 43 Coraopolis,
 44 Hills Borough,
 45 traces this --- as

1 green jewel of an arc
 2 southern suburbs, and
 3 and recreation
 4 tying into the Port
 5 just as we've been
 6 We have a branch to
 7 --- world class
 8 here, Christina.
 9 But in any case, you know --- and so we kept at
 10 it. All these volunteers kept at it, you know, for 30
 11 years now. And you know, we listened, we learned, we kept
 12 going. In one words, the story in one word is
 13 persistence. I think all of my colleagues would agree
 14 with that. It's persistence. And now we've created this
 15 recognition,
 16 and we're
 17 But even more than that, I just want to say that
 18 what's --- what's even maybe more important than that is
 19 that --- is that you folks right here, Allegheny County,
 20 which is where it started --- when the county acquired the
 21 right-of-way is where it started. Now it's sort of
 22 circled all the way around and that --- you folks are
 23 recognizing us. And so that is deeply, deeply
 24 appreciated, that we're --- that we're being recognized
 25 right here in our hometown. And we want to continue to
 26 deliver a great --- a great facility for you. So thank
 27 you very much. And I would like to present, Sue --- I
 28 would like to present to --- since they're here, to Sue
 29 and John, representing the Council, a little commemorative
 30 mile marker of Montour Trail for Trail of the Year.
 31 MS MEANS: We'll have to fight over it.
 32 MR. WILLIAMS: Okay
 33 MS MEANS: Thank you so much.
 34 MR. WILLIAMS: Well, maybe you can do it like
 35 the Stanley Cup. Maybe you can like each take it home for
 36 a week?
 37 MS MEANS: Thank you. Oh, that's so kind of
 38 you. Thank you
 39 MR. WILLIAMS: Okay. Certainly. Okay.

40 skills. And then when they're 16 through 18, they're
41 trying to place them in jobs. They also have residential
42 options and they also have community based support. And
43 so it was a very --- and that is service coordination,
44 family-based mental health services, adoption services,
45 outpatient treatment programs and independence ahead

1 transition age youth program. Now the County Health
 2 Department, through Human Services takes a --- uses a lot
 3 of the Pressley Ridge.
 4 And if you have questions about Pressley Ridge,
 5 please visit their website at PressleyRidge.org or call
 6 412-872-9400. And I just wanted to say, too, that
 7 Pressley Ridge has an 85-percent success rate with their
 8 foster care. So they either place the children in a ---
