Now, members of the citizenty came before us two years ago, County Council, when the Board of Health took a similar action, and we were sympathetic at that time to their cause But what happened was they — it's obvious to me, but I'm not an attorney — that they violated the Sunshine Act when they took this vote on this resolution because they didn't post it ahead of time on the agenda The public was not able to see what it — what the words of the resolution were.
