 44 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. 10933-19.

1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: We're going to 10932-18
 2 (sic) Bob Macey? Are you going to read that off or are
 3 you going to ---?
 4 MR. MACEY: Yes, Mr. President, I'll read it. I
 5 just want to mention that this Proclamation is
 6 co-sponsored by all members of Council and here we go.
 7 WHEREAS, born of a belief in local broadcasting
 8 and a dream of community service, KDKA is a pioneer in
 9 broadcasting that always held close to its fundamental
 10 mission and made sure to provide constant news to the
 11 people of Allegheny County and the surrounding region and;
 12 WHEREAS, on Tuesday, January 11th, 1949,
 13 Pittsburgh's first television station was launched. WDTV,
 14 part of DuMont television network and later became known
 15 as KDKA and;
 16 WHEREAS, a few years later, WDTV realized the
 17 need for 24-hour programming, and in March 1952, it became
 18 the first television station in the country to broadcast a
 19 24-hour program and;
 20 WHEREAS, in 1954, the station moved to Gateway
 21 Center in Downtown Pittsburgh and changed the letters from
 22 WDTV to KDKA, becoming America's first radio and
 23 television station committed to local programming and;
 24 WHEREAS, over the years, KDKA has an extensive
 25 and impressive list of renowned TV anchors. Some of
 26 KDKA's early anchors included Dave Murray, Al McDowell,
 27 Paul Long and Don Riggs. From 1953 to 1986, Bill Burns
 28 was the face of KDKA-TV. In the 1960s, KDKA became one of
 29 the first stations to hire African-American reporters and
 30 give more prominent roles to female journalists, including
 31 journalist Marie Torre, and other notable long-time KDKA
 32 newscasters have included Bob Kudzma, Bill Currie, Wayne
 33 Van Dine, Al Julius, Patrice King Brown, Lynne
 34 Hayes-Freeland, Harold Hayes, Mary Robb Jackson, Ralph
 35 Iannotti, Bob Pompeani, Jon Burnett, Stacy Smith, Paul
 36 Martino, Brenda Waters and John Shunway, just to name a
 37 few and;
 38 WHEREAS, KDKA has been a staple in Allegheny
 39 County broadcasting and the nation's news coverage. In a
 40 true testament to that, KDKA's anchors have been sent
 41 around the world on assignments visiting places like
 42 Russia, Vietnam, Israel, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia and The
 43 Vatican. The station has been present for three of the
 44 Pirates' five World Series championships, all five of the

 32 effective through December 31st, 2024. Sponsored by the

 34 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be referred to the

 36 MR. BARKER: Approving the reappointment of Lynn
 37 Heckman to serve as a member of the Southwestern
 38 Pennsylvania Commission for a term effective through
 39 December 31st, 2022. Sponsored by the Chief Executive.
 40 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10939-19.
 41 MR. BARKER: I apologize, refer 10938-19 to the
 42 Committee on Appointment Review as well.
 43 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah, we read that one.
 44 MR. BARKER: Thank you. 10939-19. Approving
 45 the reappointment of Clifford B. Levine to serve as a

1 member of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Commission for a
 2 term effective through December 31st, 2022. Sponsored by
 3 the Chief Executive
 4 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be referred to the
 5 Committee on Appointment Review 10939-19
 6 MR BARKER: Actually, we just did 10939-19, but
 7 before proceeding, please let the record reflect that Mr.
 8 Klein is present. I believe 10940 is next
 9 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Did you --- did we do 10939
 10 dash ---?
 11 MR BARKER: Correct, we did. That was Mr.
 12 Levine
 13 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Oh, yeah, Okay. We'll go
 14 down to unfinished business, nothing. Liaison reports?
 15 MS. MEANS: Mr. President?
 16 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yes?
 17 MS. MEANS: Well, thank you for recognizing me.
 18 Councilwoman Prizio and I, we attended the Carnegie
 19 Library of Pittsburgh's legislative briefing for elected
 20 officials, and that was my first time to the Carnegie
 21 library in many years. I was so impressed at so many
 22 things our library has to offer people. People are
 23 probably not aware that there are like 12 libraries just
 24 in Pittsburgh. There are --- they have resume help. They
 25 can give people career guidelines. They have study helps.
 26 They have a room where they have like the books you need
 27 to study for your nurses exam or to become a realtor.
 28 They also have small business help. They can
 29 help nonprofits apply for grants. I mean, there is a
 30 wealth of help there. And the --- the library downtown in
 31 Pittsburgh is a very busy library, and they are going to
 32 double the size of it by going up one level in that
 33 library. They also have a recollection studio. So people
 34 don't know this, you can go there and use their equipment
 35 to take your slides and your old family videos and turn
 36 them into digital media for yourself.
 37 They also have a collection, a genealogy room,
 38 where they have a collection of over 100,000 pictures of
 39 Pittsburgh. So maybe you could go and find out where
 40 grandma lived and get a picture of the house where grandma
 41 lived. And then, you have to pay to make copies of it,
 42 but really it's an amazing facility. They're there to
 43 help. They're helping people find jobs and giving them
 44 training. And they also have a lot of children's rooms

1 great. If anybody wants to come and support junior
 2 achievement on February 8th, that should be a good event
 3 The night before is the North Pittsburgh Chamber
 4 of Commerce annual meeting. If anybody would want to
 5 come, it represents the --- the North Pittsburgh area.
 6 It's a great chamber and I'm up for their young
 7 professional award so that should be a nice night
 8 Other things going on. The Coro MLK awards are
 9 back and they are taking place on February 2nd. We have
 10 that event for ACBA the same night, so if you want to have
 11 a double-header and go to two different events in one
 12 night, they're both going to be fantastic and --- and
 13 should be really good. Big Brothers, Big Sisters annual
 14 Super Bowl party is on the 3rd, if anybody is interested
 15 in coming to support Big Brothers, Big Sisters. It's all
 16 about recruiting people to get involved.
 17 And I have to mention it because it's her 65th
 18 birthday but happy birthday to my mom. And out of all 15
 19 of you, only Councilwoman Prizio wished my mom a happy
 20 birthday on Facebook. So thanks to Anita for doing that,
 21 but happy 65th. And we'll be celebrating tomorrow.
 22 Tomorrow is my daughter's first birthday, so my mom will
 23 be celebrating her 65th all day with Lila June. So that's
 24 all for me, Mr. President.
 25 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 26 MR. BAKER: Sorry to those in the crowd for
 27 having to learn all that, but lots of good events going in
 28 the city and the County.
 29 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Seeing no more liaison
 30 reports, we'll move on 10940-19

1 and teenagers rooms, and hey, and down at the Oakland one,
 2 they even have a coffee shop.
 3 So it was amazing, and they also have a special
 4 library for music. People don't realize that we have one
 5 of the greatest selections of sheet music and in some of
 6 the libraries, they even have like keyboards and guitars
 7 that kids can take out, so that was very informative and
 8 very exciting. Thank you for recognizing me.
 9 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Somebody had their hand up
 10 down there. Oh, Representative Prizio?
 11 MS. PRIZIO: Oh, thank you very much for
 12 recognizing me. I just wanted to make everyone aware that
 13 tomorrow at the Community Economic Development Corporation
 14 of Clairton, there is going to be a press conference
 15 highlighting the concerns about the incident with the
 16 Clairton Coke Works. Chelsea Wagner and Summer Lee are
 17 going to be speaking in addition to the members of the
 18 Breathe Collaboration, and all community members are ---
 19 are invited and that'll be at three o'clock in --- at the
 20 CEDCC.
 21 And the other event that I'd like to mention is
 22 on Wednesday, February 6th. It's called Achieving
 23 Medicare For All with Wendell Potter. Wendell Potter is a
 24 healthcare reform advocate and New York Times bestselling
 25 author and a former health insurance industry executive
 26 who blew the whistle on the industry's unethical business
 27 practices in testimony to the US Senate. He is the
 28 president of the Business Initiative for Health Policy.
 29 This will be taking place on Wednesday, February 6th from
 30 5:30 to 7:30 at the Cathedral of Learning and the
 31 reception begins at 5:30. Everyone is invited. It's a
 32 public event. Thank you very much.
 33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Thank you,
 34 Representative Baker?
 35 MR. BAKER: Oh, thank you, Mr. President. Just
 36 a couple quick ones. The annual Inspiring Success event
 37 --- and I know we've had junior achievement down here a
 38 couple times to speak with us and share with us. Robbie
 39 from junior achievement was actually our first marketing
 40 meeting that we had, so their event is February 8th. It's
 41 a lunch time gathering. I was actually there ---
 42 Caliguri --- Mayor Caliguri, honoree last year. So it's
 43 great to help pick the --- the future --- the honorees
 44 that will be celebrated on February 8th. So that'll be

1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be referred to the
 2 Committee on Health and Human Services. 10942-19
 3 MR. BARKER: An Ordinance of the County of
 4 Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, authorizing the
 5 acceptance of approximately ten acres of land located
 6 adjacent to the County's North Park. Sponsored by the
 7 Chief Executive.
 8 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be referred to the
 9 Committee on Parks. New business, no motions.
 10 Notification of contracts?
 11 MR. BARKER: We have none.
 12 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Public comment on general
 13 items.
 14 MR. BARKER: We have a pair. First up is Juliet
 15 Zavon.
 16 MS. ZAVON: Do I have this right (adjusting
 17 microphone)? You can tell I'm not used to public
 18 speaking. Sorry. What are the issues that are most
 19 important to you, public safety, education, taxation?
 20 Everything you care about starts with a vote, with
 21 elections, but there are problems in Allegheny County
 22 elections. I'm going to give you three examples from my
 23 own experience and then draw some conclusions.
 24 The three examples are volunteering to be a poll
 25 worker, polling places and absentee ballots. Volunteering
 26 to be a poll worker. I volunteered to be a poll worker
 27 this summer and got no response at all from the elections
 28 division. Months went by, no word. Days before the
 29 election, they called me to assign me to a polling place.
 30 I was flabbergasted. When I hadn't heard from them, I
 31 made other arrangements to volunteer on Election Day.
 32 Recruiting polling workers is a problem in
 33 Allegheny County. Is it any wonder? I know other people
 34 you have had similar experiences to mine. In Ohio, where
 35 I've been a poll worker, you get a packet with orientation
 36 information by return mail. It includes multiple dates
 37 for the mandatory training session. You sign up for one.
 38 This isn't rocket science. It's good administration.
 39 Polling places. When I had no response and I
 40 wanted to work for the polls, I gave up and I volunteered
 41 for election protection. You have a copy of the memo I
 42 wrote summarizing the problems I found. These include
 43 absence of signage, locked doors. Yep, locked doors to
 44 polling places, and no secure chain of custody for
 45 emergency paper ballots that had to be used in one

1 location. The emergency paper ballots were put in a
 2 plastic storage tub, the kind you'd pick up at Home Depot
 3 to store old shoes in or something.
 4 And then, my third point is absentee ballots. I
 5 personally know 10 people who did not receive absentee
 6 ballots. One of them sits among you. The --- what's
 7 that? Oh, sorry. You can tell I'm not ---
 8 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: You got to go 'til that red
 9 light
 10 MS. ZAVON: The --- the elections division
 11 repeatedly said we're sending out the absentee ballots
 12 tomorrow but they never arrived. In jurisdictions where
 13 I've been a resident, a person who applies for an absentee
 14 ballot gets a tracking number so they can monitor when the
 15 --- the absentee ballot is sent out and they --- they can
 16 also track when it's received back at the --- at the Board
 17 of Elections. Not so in Allegheny County.
 18 The elections division is like a black box. I
 19 care deeply about democracy. That's why I wanted to be a
 20 poll worker. What are best practices for election
 21 administration and how does Allegheny County measure up?
 22 When has anyone really asked that question? At a time
 23 when the U.S. news is filled with reports about election
 24 problems ---
 25 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: If you got one sentence or
 26 so, finish up.
 27 MS. ZAVON: Okay.
 28 Do --- do I push something to ---?
 29 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: No, no.
 30 MS. ZAVON: Oh, okay. Sorry I'm a novice,
 31 forgive me.
 32 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah, just make it quick.
 33 MS. ZAVON: Three sentences. At a time when the
 34 U.S. is filled with reports about election problems of all
 35 sorts, the public is understandably uneasy. My three
 36 examples are symptoms of deeper systemic problems that
 37 erode public trust, leave the County open to scandal and
 38 lawsuits. Thank you for your time. Sorry.
 39 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Thank you.
 40 MS. ZAVON: I'll --- I'll do better next time.
 41 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Give us the next one.
 42 MR. BARKER: Next up is Gwen DiPietro.
 43 MS. DIPIETRO: Hello.
 44 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Hello.

1 I often had at least six people sitting at my
 2 table trying to figure out where they were registered, if
 3 they were registered and how to process them through the
 4 provisional balloting system. We submitted 49 provisional
 5 ballots. None of those provisional ballots resulted in
 6 successful votes being cast. Many success --- frustrated
 7 students told me that they had registered on campus in
 8 August and September, well ahead of the deadlines. A
 9 number of them showed me e-mails from the outside
 10 organization that they had registered with, telling me
 11 that their registration had been successful and to show up
 12 to vote.
 13 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Go another sentence or so,
 14 because you're over the three
 15 MS. DIPIETRO: I'm almost done. Thank you.
 16 None of these were in the County system. I don't know if
 17 these were inside or outside issues, but the County needs
 18 additional outreach to voters, to new voters, in order to
 19 successfully get these voters on the rolls.
 20 Last, the idea that each poll worker must work
 21 the whole day is really brutal. Split shifts would be a
 22 humane process that would get more volunteers on the
 23 books. Thank you so much.
 24 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Does someone want to
 25 make a motion to adjourn?
 26 MR. WALTON: Motion to adjourn.
 27 MR. PALMIERE: Second.
 28 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: All those in favor signify
 29 by saying aye.
 30 (Chorus of ayes.)
 31 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Opposed?
 32 The ayes have it. Meeting adjourned. Thank
 33 you.

MEETING CONCLUDED AT 5 27 P M

1 MS. DIPIETRO: My name is Gwen DiPietro. Thank
 2 you for this opportunity to speak to you. I'm an
 3 experienced judge of elections and a poll worker at 14-7,
 4 which is the Carnegie Mellon polling place.
 5 During the general elections, we process up to
 6 1,500 voters. These long days are extremely challenging
 7 and sometimes it does not go well. I have three
 8 recommendations based on my Election Day experiences, and
 9 the first has to do with super poll training. So the
 10 training that we receive from the County, while well
 11 delivered, is geared toward a more typical one table
 12 polling place. Seventy-five (75) percent of the County's
 13 polling places have 500 or fewer voters this past
 14 November.
 15 In contrast, the 32 largest polling places each
 16 process between 1,000 and 1,500 voters. These super polls
 17 have very different logistics from the typical polling
 18 place. The 14-7 Board has invented ways to process our
 19 voters efficiently. In the past, we only had one table
 20 holding all 4,000 of our registered voter cards and
 21 district registers.
 22 For the 2012 election, we split our materials
 23 into two tables, A through L and M through Z which helped
 24 significantly, but still left us with two hour long lines.
 25 Last year, we asked the County to give us three sets of
 26 materials and sufficient poll workers to staff three
 27 tables. As a result, our lines were never longer than 20
 28 minutes and we still processed over 1,100 voters.
 29 Despite my Board's innovations, we're volunteers
 30 and we're sort of working in a vacuum. We don't know how
 31 other super polls deal with these challenges and maybe
 32 they could benefit from our ideas or us from them. The
 33 election division must provide more and different training
 34 for the super polls. At the university super polls, CMU,
 35 Pitt, Duquesne, as a few examples, we process many, many
 36 first time voters and it's critical that they have a
 37 successful experience as they exercise their right and
 38 responsibility to vote for the first time.
 39 Second challenge, registration. We saw too many
 40 potential voters who believed that they had successfully
 41 registered, but were not in our boxes or our registers.
 42 This was really frustrating. I spent half of my time as
 43 the judge working with these voters, trying to get through
 44 to the County help line or the online system which was
 45 overwhelmed and did not work well, neither system.
