# Maternal and Infant Health Allegheny County Health Department Family and Child Health Services

The mission of Family and Child Health Services is to improve the quality of life and health of mothers/birthing persons, infants, children, and families in Allegheny County. Efforts are focused on meeting the unique needs of each family regardless of circumstances.

#### **Home Visiting Services**

As part of the Home Visiting Program, our nurses meet with you in the comfort of your own home, or in another location where you will feel at ease such as a library or restaurant. The goal is to help support you and your parenting goals. Home visiting is associated with positive outcomes for both children and families.

Family and Child Health is a collaborative partner with **Hello Baby**, an initiative to ensure all parents and caregivers have quick access to the information and resources they need to care for the youngest people in their lives. #### **Nurse-Family Partnership**

The <u>Nurse-Family Partnership</u> offers support services to women expecting their first child. Nurses provide home visits during pregnancy and offer follow-up care after birth for moms and their children up to 24 months of age. To qualify, you must live in Allegheny County and meet the income guidelines.

#### **Breastfeeding Helpline**

#### Monday-Friday from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM

All calls are referred to registered nurses, certified lactation counselors, and an internationally board-certified lactation consultant. Our team is here to help you get started, answer questions and problem solve.

Our team works with pregnant and breastfeeding mothers to educate them about the benefits of breastfeeding. They can also help them start and continue breastfeeding. This program is designed to help increase the number of mothers who breastfeed their infants in Allegheny County.

#### We C.A.R.E

We offer three types of <u>Title V</u> support services, which are now branded into our *We C.A.R.E.* program:

Maternal and Child Health: Our nurses provide home visits during pregnancy and after birth to make sure families get the medical services they need and offer information to improve their health.

**Children with Special Health Care Needs**: Our nurses offer medical service assistance, home visits, and case management to families with children who have special health care needs.

**Liaison Nursing**: Our nurses give information and educational materials about maternal and child health to doctors, hospitals, school nurses, and community organizations.

#### Cribs for Kids

#### **Smoking Cessation**

Smoking cessation support is available to pregnant women. Lead by a Certified Tobacco Treatment Specialist, individual and group counseling is available. #### **Father/Partner Engagement Program**

The father/partner engagement program is designed to provide a positive outlet for fathers. Our Father/Partner Engagement Specialists are trained to help new parents meet their goals and help them grow through their parenting journey. Services include:

# Allegheny County Health Department Women, Infants, and Children Program

The Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) program offers a variety of health and nutrition services for medically or nutritionally at-risk mothers and children including:

- Individualized nutrition education
- Supplemental nutritious foods and infant formula
- Breastfeeding support
- Referrals to health care and community services
- Immunization screenings
- New eWIC EBT cards can be used at participating grocery stores for infant formula, milk, eggs, cheese, cereal, juices and other nutritious foods.

#### **Infant Formula Shortage Resources**

#### Who can get WIC?

- Pregnant women
- Breastfeeding women or bottle-feeding women who recently had a baby
- Infants up to 1 year of age
- Children up to 5 years of age
- A custodial father, foster parent, or legal guardian of a child up to age 5 may apply to receive WIC benefits for that child

Please note, USA citizenship is not required to get WIC.

#### How do I qualify for WIC?

You and/or your child need to:

- Meet medical or nutritional risk criteria
- Meet income guidelines

If you or your child is on Medical Assistance, Food Stamps, or TANF, you automatically meet the WIC income guidelines. Many working families qualify for WIC. Please visit our <u>WIC Enrollment Information page</u> for more information about enrollment.

Funding is provided by the United States Department of Agriculture. WIC is administered by the Department of Health at the State level, and the Allegheny County Health Department at the local level. In accordance with Federal law and U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, WIC is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability: <u>USDA/WIC Nondiscrimination Statement</u>.

#### WIC Enrollment Information

There are four ways to get started with WIC:

- Visit the <u>PA WIC website</u> and complete an online pre-application
- Print out a paper application (see "WIC Applications" below) and take it to your health care provider
- Call 412-350-5801 to request an application through the mail
- Stop by one of our WIC Clinics to pick up a paper application

Once you submit your application, our staff will review it to determine if you qualify for the program. If eligible, we'll contact you and set an appointment for you to come into one of our offices to get enrolled.

Currently, WIC serves 16,000 participants in Allegheny County, but we have funding to serve more applicants. We encourage anyone who is potentially eligible to enroll in WIC. Don't delay, apply today!

If you live outside of Allegheny County, please call <u>1-800-WIC-WINS</u> to get more information about WIC in your area.

<u>WIC Shopper</u> – this is super cool new app that PA residents can download. They can get their WIC balances and scan products to make sure that they are WIC eligible. Not all stores identify WIC eligible products accept via the ginormous poster that stores often hang at the entrance, which really isn't helpful when you are knee deep in the store with a little one and you are trying to grocery shop. Residents can just scan the product, and the app will let them know if that product is eligible. Saves the resident frustration and embarrassment when they check out.

#### **Adult Immunizations**

#### **Childhood Immunizations**

Federally funded and administered free of charge to eligible children. Additionally, Compliance with Allegheny County and Pennsylvania School Immunization Laws is assured through regular audits of school health records. See <a href="CDC's">CDC's</a> recommended Immunization Schedules.

#### **Travel Immunizations**

Arranged for persons of all ages, as determined after appropriate travel advice meeting.

#### **Screening Tests:**

Blood testing to determine antibody levels for diseases

#### **Immunization Clinic Payment Options**

Vaccination fees may be paid by cash, Visa, Mastercard, or Discover. We do NOT accept American Express. A fee will be charged for credit or debit card use. Prices for services are subject to change. *Effective 6/13/2019, the health department no longer accepts personal checks.* 

We are now able to accept most insurance coverage; please see the <u>Accepted Insurance</u> <u>List</u> to make sure your insurer is included. We are not able to accept health savings account or flexible spending account funds.

The Tuberculosis Clinic is open and providing TB skin tests. Appointments for testing are preferred, but walk-ins are also welcome. Please call the clinic at <u>412-578-7915</u> or <u>412-578-8162</u> to schedule your appointment.

#### **Hours of Operation**

We provide routine tuberculosis screenings. These screenings are often needed as a condition for employment or entry to school.

Routine tuberculosis screenings are offered on the following days:

**Monday:** 9:00 am - 3:30 pm **Tuesday:** 9:00 am - 3:30 pm **Friday:** 9:00 am - 3:30 pm

Screenings are available by appointment, but walk-ins are accepted. Please call <u>412-578-7915</u> or <u>412-578-8162</u> to schedule an appointment. The Pulmonary Center does not offer Quantiferon (QFT or IGRA) screening; this is a specific blood test to detect antibodies to Tuberculosis. To obtain this test we suggest that you contact your PCP.

#### **Payment Information**

The fee is \$25 for one-step testing and \$35 for two-step testing.

**NOTE:** ACHD only accepts payment for services in the form of money order, or cash (exact amount). The program does not accept payment by credit and debit card. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. The health department no longer accepts personal checks.

#### **Other Pulmonary Center Services**

For patients who test positive for TB, our public health nurses provide contact follow-up services to identify and reach out to close contacts who might have been exposed.

They also offer home visits for patient evaluations and can provide medication as indicated.

We can also provide medication to patients of private physicians with a valid prescription. Our clinic also maintains databases of tuberculosis disease incidence and prevalence across Allegheny County, as well as providing educational programs and materials to health care professionals and the general public.
