Higher rate in Black 11x persons compared with White persons

GONORRHEA



2,455 new cases 3% decrease from 2022



63% of cases in males Highest among ages 25-34

Higher rate in Black persons compared with White persons

EARLY SYPHILIS



279 new cases 2% increase from 2022



Males accounted for 85% of early syphilis cases

Early Syphilis Risk Factors Among Males (n=237)

- Oral sex in last year (74%)
- Sex with a male in last year (64%)
- History of previous STDs (61%)
- Anal sex in last year (55%)
- Multiple sex partners in last year (70%)
- Sexually active women <25 years should get tested for gonorrhea and chlamydia at least annually
- Gay, bisexual, & men who have sex with men should be tested for all STIs at least annually
- Everyone between 13-64 years should get an HIV test at least once as part of routine care or more frequently if at high risk of STIs
- Pregnant persons should get syphilis screenings at 1st visit, 3rd trimester, and delivery
- Talk to your healthcare provider about DoxyPEP to reduce your chances of getting syphilis and chlamydia
