### **Ordinances:**

Bill No. 12916-24 - An ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, amending and supplementing the Allegheny County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 475, entitled "Taxation," by the creation of a new Article XII entitled "Volunteer Service Tax Credit Program" in order to establish a uniform program of Allegheny County real property tax incentives for certain volunteer service providers.

Bill No. 12917-24 - An ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, amending and supplementing the Administrative Code of Allegheny County, Article 207, entitled "New Board of Property Assessment Appeals and Review," §5-207.03, entitled "Qualifications of Board Members, appointment; terms: organization of Appeals Board, and §5-207.04, entitled "Compliance with County Procedures," in order to establish uniform training requirements for members of the Board and any hearing officers retained by the Board.

Bill No. 12918-24 - An ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, amending and supplementing the Administrative Code of Allegheny County, Article 207, entitled "New Board of Property Assessment Appeals and Review," §5-207.06, entitled "Rules and regulations for appeals," in order to establish a uniform, expeditious process for rendering decisions regarding real property assessment appeals.


*Bill No.* 12951-24 - An Ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, extending the County real estate tax discount deadline from March 31, 2024 to April 30, 2024, and the gross/face period deadline from May 1, 2024 to May 31, 2024.

### **Motions:**

*Bill No.* 12941-24 - Motion of the Council of Allegheny County urging the expeditious passage of H.B. 1972, introduced by Representative Rob Matzie in the PA House of Representatives, that will look to comprehensively overhaul the structure and authority, review the finances, and examine the continued viability of the PA Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA).

### **Resolutions:**

*Bill No.* 12858-23 - Resolution of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania adopting the Grants Budget, Special Accounts Budget, and Agency Fund Budget, by setting forth appropriations to pay said expenses during the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2024 and ending December 31, 2024 (2024 Fiscal Year).

# Why recycle glass?

Glass is still one of the most recyclable materials we generate in our homes and should not be trashed. Glass bottles and jars are 100% recyclable and can be recycled endlessly without losing any quality! This makes the effort to put these items back into the recycling ecosystem even more important.

# How do I prepare the glass?

Containers should be empty and rinsed. Lids and labels don't need to be removed. Please remember that any bags and boxes used to carry the glass must be taken with you and discarded off-site.
