Medicaid Eligibility PA Health Law Project offers an article that begins with "Pennsylvania's Medicaid program, also known as "Medical Assistance", provides comprehensive health care coverage for vulnerable populations and people with limited incomes. Historically, Medicaid was only available to narrow groups, such as low-income children and adults with disabilities. But in 2015, Pennsylvania adopted Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Now, children and adults can qualify for coverage based solely on having limited income. Medicaid's broad coverage ensures access to care so people of all ages and abilities can live healthy and full lives.

People must apply for Medicaid coverage and renew their benefits each year. Even though there are a number of ways to qualify for Medicaid coverage, people do not have to apply for a specific category or program."
