Wesley Spectrum offers out-of-home placement services in the least restrictive, family-like setting to children from birth to 21 years old. Foster care options include traditional, treatment, CRR, medically fragile and kinship care. Placements can be planned or as an emergency.

Wesley Spectrum recruits resource families that represent diverse racial/ethnic composition and geographical locations in Southwestern Pennsylvania. Wesley Spectrum welcomes single parents, married couples, couples in committed relationships, intergenerational families and LGBT families. The foster care program is only one part of Wesley Spectrum. Other programs include a diverse range of autism, behavioral health, education, and family support services to meet the needs of those we serve. Wesley Spectrum resource families say the training and support offered to them is the cornerstone to providing a safe, secure environment to the children in need who are placed in their care.
