Once authorized, call 412-350-2267 between the hours of 8:00 and 10:00 am. All items will be brought to the front lobby for distribution between 1:45 and 2:00 pm on the same day.

Process for Visitation

Friends and family must register their information at the visitor's window in the main lobby of the jail or by calling 412-350-2413. Once your information is in the system you will schedule your visit at ALLEGHENYPA.GTLVISITME.COM. Or by calling 1-855-208-7349. Visits must be booked two days in advanced and up to seven days out. Visitors must report in to the visitor's window 15 minutes before a scheduled visit.

The visiting week for all inmates begins Sunday and ends Saturday. Inmates in general population are permitted two visits per week, but only one visit per day. Inmates in disciplinary housing are permitted one visit per week.

For a baby, visitors may take a bottle, a small blanket, one diaper and wipes that can be in a clear baggie, No cases.

Dress appropriately and follow the jail's dress code which stipulates:

- Undergarments are required as a condition of any visit
- Shirt and shoes must be worn at all times
- Tops must cover the entire trunk of the body
- Shorts are permitted only if they are modestly cut (no upper thigh or buttocks visible)
- No coats or jackets that are outerwear (suit jackets and cardigans are permitted)
- No hooded clothing or headgear unless worn for religious reasons
- No clothing that is sheer or see-through (mesh) material
- No muscle shirts, halter tops, crop tops, sleeveless or
- Strapless shirts/dresses
- No clothing with excessive pockets, metal, or drawstrings
- No clothing that displays a gang affiliation or is in any way attributable to gang culture
- No clothing that is obscene, racist, or displays sexual content
- No Sleepwear
- No Uniform of any type
- NO RED TOPS!!!
- Ex-Inmates must be out of jail for one full year.

Visiting lobby officers may deny entry into the jail to anyone they deem inappropriately dressed.

- Arrive unimpaired by the use of alcohol or other drugs. A person suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or other drugs will not be permitted to visit.
- Proceed through a metal detecting scan.
- Produce current photo identification that includes date of birth at the visitor's window.

- Receive a visitor's pass in exchange for the photo identification. The photo identification is returned at the conclusion of the visit in exchange for the visitor's pass.
- All contact visitors and other random visitors may be asked to pass through a scanner which detects drugs and drug residue.

• **List of Acceptable Forms of Visitors Identification**

1. Driver's license or I.D. issued by a state or outlying territory of the United States provided it contains a photograph and information such as name, date of birth, sex, height, eye color and address
2. I.D. card issued by a federal, state or local government agency or entity provided it contains a photograph and information such as name, date of birth, sex, height, eye color and address
3. U.S. Passport
4. Certificate of U.S. Citizenship (INS Form N-560 or N-561)
5. Certificate of Naturalization (INS Form N-550 or N-570)
6. Alien Registration Receipt Card with photograph
7. (INS Form I-151 or I-551)
8. Temporary Resident Card (INS Form I- 688)

Returning funds to released inmates

The Cashier's Office is notified when released inmates are waiting in the main lobby for their funds. Released inmates receive a check for any amount owed that's over \$10 and they receive cash for any amount owed that's less than \$10. In the evening after the banks are closed, the inmate will receive some cash with a check for the remaining balance. For example, if a person is owed \$50, he or she will receive up to \$10 in cash with a check for the remaining balance. Hours for paying released inmates are between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm, Monday through Friday.

We encourage released individuals to cash their check at the PNC bank located on the corner of Grant St. and Forbes Ave. This PNC branch accepts the armband as a form of identification to cash checks.

Note: After 10 days, money will only be turned over to an attorney or the Clerk of Courts.

Clothing for Court

Persons on an inmate's visiting list, attorneys or religious advisors are the only persons authorized to drop off clothing for an inmate's court appearance. Individuals leaving clothing must be properly identified by a I.D. card. If proper I.D. is not provided, or the individual is not listed on the inmate's visiting list, acceptance of articles for the inmate will be denied. Clothing may be dropped off a maximum of three days prior to the inmate's Common Pleas Criminal Court hearing. Clothing is only accepted in the evenings between 7:00 and 8:00 pm.

Special Needs

Inmate family member will have the below time frames to drop off any prescription glasses, contacts or dentures. Those wishing to drop off any of these items, will need to contact Deputy Chief Warden Laura Williams before drop off. Contact solution is not allowed. Drop off times are every Tuesday between 9:00 and 11:00 am and every Saturday between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm.

Money Order

A money order may be sent through the mail. The inmate's DOC number must be written on the money order.

Western Union Quick Collect

Western Union has a system called Quick Collect. Specific information on using this system is available from Western Union. There is no transaction fee at the jail for using this system.

Kiosks

All in-person deposits are made using kiosks in the jail lobby. The Kiosks are available during lobby hours from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. The kiosks accept cash, debit and credit cards. This system is provided through a contract with Keefe Commissary Network. The kiosk charges a \$3 fee on each transaction. Deposit limits are \$300 cash and \$50 on debit and credit cards.
