1 So thanks to Marilyn, thanks to everyone that
 2 serves in the library and the libraries. And thanks to
 3 Councilman Catena for letting me be a part of this.
 4 MR. CATENA: I'll let you read it, Tom. I'll
 5 let you read this one.
 6 MR. BAKER: (Adjusts microphone) Thanks,
 7 Councilman. All right. Marilyn and colleagues.
 8 WHEREAS, libraries are not just what we have for
 9 people, but what we do for and with people; and
 10 WHEREAS, libraries have long served as trusted
 11 and treasured institutions, and library workers and
 12 librarians fuel efforts to better their communities,
 13 campuses and schools; and
 14 WHEREAS, librarians continue to fulfill their
 15 role in leveling the playing field for all who seek
 16 information and access to technologies, especially as our
 17 society is at a critical juncture regarding the changing
 18 information landscape and the skills needed to thrive in
 19 our digital world; and
 20 WHEREAS, libraries and librarians open a world
 21 of possibilities through innovative STEAM programing,
 22 Makerspaces, job-seeking resources and the power of
 23 reading, and I would say a sense of community as well; and
 24 WHEREAS, libraries and librarians are looking
 25 beyond their traditional roles and providing more
 26 opportunities for community engagement and delivering new
 27 services that connect closely with patrons' needs; and
 28 WHEREAS, libraries support democracy and effect
 29 social change through their commitment to provide
 30 equitable access to information for all library users
 31 regardless of all different things and they're open for
 32 everyone and truly very welcoming to everyone; and
 33 WHEREAS, libraries, librarians, library workers
 34 and supporters across America are celebrating National
 35 Library Week;
 36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the
 37 Allegheny County Council does hereby proclaim April 9th
 38 through 15th, 2017 to be "National Library Week" in
 39 Allegheny County. We encourage all residents to visit the
 40 library this week and explore what's new at your library,
 41 and engage with your librarian. Because of you and our
 42 experts in the library, Libraries Transform.
 43 So congratulations. That's sponsored by
 44 Councilman Catena and all of us on County Council.

 3 MR. CATENA: (Adjusts microphone) Good evening,
 4 everyone. Nothing makes me prouder than to be able to
 5 present this proclamation tonight for National Library
 6 Week. Throughout the Allegheny County, there are so many
 7 outstanding libraries. I'm blessed, actually, in my
 8 hometown in Carnegie, to actually have the Andrew Carnegie
 9 Free Library and Music Hall, which is --- the outstanding
 10 Maggie Forbes is the director there.
 11 But society means so much to everyday members of
 12 the community, because people come to libraries,
 13 basically, to educate themselves and they serve the true
 14 meaning of democracy and furthering democracy. And like I
 15 said, I --- it's nothing more important than tonight, for
 16 me to be here, honoring the library folks because of how
 17 much it means to the children of the community and our
 18 future, because that they're what's going to lead us.
 19 MR. BAKER: Thanks, Councilman. Well, it's
 20 great to be here as well. All my friends from the --- the
 21 Library Association just joined or got elected to
 22 Marilyn's Board last week, so looking forward to serving
 23 on the ACLA Board. It's a double process so I can get
 24 elected at 6:00 and 7:00. So luckily, we made it.
 25 MS. JENKINS: But you passed (indicates).
 26 MR. BARKER: We both got --- we both passed, so
 27 very much looking forward to that. Love being a member of
 28 the Northland Public Library. I will say working with
 29 Marilyn and Amy Steele from Northland Library --- we
 30 started doing office hours, there, District One office
 31 hours. And we'll be teaming up with Councilwoman Kirk,
 32 later this month, to do that joint at a library there in
 33 Northland with Cindy Kirk, Councilwoman Kirk. I used to
 34 be on the Foundation Board. We'll be at the gala together
 35 on April 22nd.
 36 Councilman DeMarco's going to be joining me at
 37 your library --- library, Amanda Kirby, out in Western
 38 Allegheny Library, so that will be great. Many of the
 39 libraries, in general, are a good way for all of us, all
 40 15 of us to get the word out to our constituents. Talk to
 41 them, share with them. Aaron Pittman will make you just a
 42 little box and you can take it and share the information
 43 that we have about the county with all of our constituents
 44 there at the library.

 4 Association for your support for the libraries. Allegheny
 5 County has been a longstanding partner and supporter for
 6 the Allegheny County Library Association, so thank you and

 28 Board for a term to expire on December 31st, 2019.
 29 Sponsored by the Chief Executive.
 30 MR. MACEY: Motion to approve.
 31 MR. DEMARCO: Second.
 32 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Under remarks? Seeing none,
 33 all those in favor signify by saying aye.
 34 (Chorus of ayes.)
 35 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Opposed? The ayes have it.
 36 10029-17.
 37 MR. BARKER: I'm sorry. 10052-17?
 38 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah.
 39 MR. BARKER: Okay. I just wanted to make sure I
 40 had the number correct. Approving the appointment of
 41 Robert Hurley to serve as a member of the Allegheny County
 42 Airport Authority for a term to expire on December 31st,
 43 2019. Sponsored by the Chief Executive.
 44 MR. MACEY: So moved.
 45 MR. DEMARCO: Second.

1 Ceremony where they inducted the 2017 class of veterans
 2 who have distinguished themselves in combat and have
 3 received awards into the Joseph A. Dugan, Junior Hall of
 4 Valor. There were, I think, 13 folks that were inducted.
 5 It was a very moving ceremony, and it's something that I
 6 wish everyone would consider attending here in the future.
 7 There's no charge.
 8 And just to show these gentleman --- if you
 9 actually heard the citations that were read where these
 10 guys talked about how these men were in combat, were
 11 wounded, grenades, mines, things like that, and they
 12 wouldn't allow themselves to be removed from the field of
 13 battle while they try to take care of their men. I'm
 14 telling you, it's just a --- and you heard some incredible
 15 stories, and these people are Allegheny County residents
 16 and veterans. They're our friends, our neighbors, the
 17 parents of many of the folks that we've grown up with and
 18 I just think it's a very --- a moving experience and it
 19 was a --- an honor to be there while they were honored.
 20 Thank you, Mr. President.
 21 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Representative Means?
 22 MS. MEANS: Yes, I had the honor of attending
 23 the --- the Disability Summit that was held in Mount
 24 Lebanon on March the 22nd to the 24th and Councilman
 25 Palmiere attended with me. We attended a class, and there
 26 were over 100 vendors, and I was just really amazed at how
 27 many opportunities we have for help in our state, in our
 28 county, for people that have disabilities.
 29 They have a lot of training for people who have
 30 disabilities into their 30s to help them find jobs and if
 31 you need help if --- if you have a loved one with
 32 disabilities, just call Dan Miller's office in Mount
 33 Lebanon, Representative Dan Miller, because he is just
 34 really doing a great job spearheading needs for --- help
 35 for people that have special needs and it was just a great
 36 event. It was just --- it was amazing. Thank you, Mr.
 37 President.
 38 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Thank you. Go ahead,
 39 Representative --- well, let me get Representative Baker,
 40 then come back to you.
 41 MR. BAKER: All right. Thanks, Mr. President.
 42 I feel like we've been seeing each other a lot lately, a
 43 lot of members of Council. But I just quickly wanted to
 44 mention two things that were not victorious, but were

1 good, Mixers and Shakers, the Airport Chamber event, was
 2 last Thursday night.
 3 Amanda Kirby, that you met earlier, from the
 4 library, was one of the mixers as well. But it was great
 5 to be part of that event and that --- that was an event
 6 that raised a lot of money for charities. It was a --- a
 7 very good --- a very good time. So I wanted to thank the
 8 Airport Chamber for putting that on.
 9 All of you were a part of congratulating the
 10 Service Summit honorees that was last Tuesday. The event
 11 went really well. We had 300 plus people there. They all
 12 were very thankful for their County Council proclamations
 13 and all the other accolades that they got that night.
 14 We did not win the free throw contest today, but
 15 it did a lot of good for --- for the Kane Foundation. A
 16 young man I've known since he was 17, 18 years old, Casey
 17 Rankin, from the Public Defender's Office made 102 free
 18 throws today. Which was pretty --- even the Moon
 19 basketball team, I think, would be impressed by that. So
 20 we held our own, and we were happy to at least be part of
 21 it. Thanks to Councilman Walton for being a part of that
 22 and thanks to Amy Downs for helping to put it together.
 23 I should mention next Thursday, Senator
 24 Vulakovich's Vietnam Veterans Ceremony. I'll be emceeing
 25 that, and I know Councilman Means and Councilman DeMarco
 26 and I were at Senator Reschenthaler's a couple months ago.
 27 It's a really nice celebration, so if anyone's watching at
 28 home or knows any Vietnam veterans that would --- from the
 29 38th Senate District that would want to be involved,
 30 please definitely let us know.
 31 And --- and I know when the library was here,
 32 they mentioned office hours. If anyone's ever interested
 33 in working together on doing office hours together,
 34 obviously we've got one coming up with Councilwoman Kirk
 35 and also Councilman DeMarco. But where you guys serve and
 36 live, if you'd ever want to do one together, I'm happy to
 37 do it with --- do it with you.
 38 Aaron Pittman puts this box together. We just
 39 go out, we have a table right in the front, we get to
 40 share with constituents about what's going on in our
 41 districts. It's a really good way to share about
 42 information. I've had a lot of success over these last
 43 two months just getting the word out that way, so thanks,
 44 Mr. President.
 45 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.

1 and the --- and it was so thorough and so absolutely
 2 beautifully done.
 3 And I --- I think the one session we were in for
 4 about an hour, an hour and a half, but it kept you
 5 spellbound, you know. It wasn't --- there weren't people
 6 nodding off like you see at so many of these, you know,
 7 presentations. It was just absolutely first rate, and I
 8 highly recommend to --- to my colleagues, if you get a
 9 chance next year when Dan has that, try to get out there
 10 one of those three days. It's very, very much worthwhile.
 11 Thank you.
 12 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Thank you. Representative
 13 DeWitt Walton?
 14 MR. WALTON: Thank you, Mr. President. I want
 15 to briefly mention the jail --- the jail tour. While I
 16 appreciate the opportunity for the members of council
 17 taking that tour, I've been spending several times a month
 18 in the --- in the county jail over the past several years,
 19 and --- as part of the work that I do with my workforce
 20 development effort.
 21 This visit, while it highlighted some of the
 22 things that go on, this is stuff that's been going on, and
 23 efforts that the county has been engaged in over a number
 24 of years to --- to try to reduce recidivism, to try to
 25 improve delivery of services, and to make sure that
 26 inmates are treated in an equitable and straightforward
 27 manner.
 28 I think that the Chief Executive, the County
 29 Manager and the warden and Barb Pares and the staff
 30 deserve a tremendous amount of credit. Because for every
 31 dollar that we --- that we spend on reducing the
 32 opportunities for folks to come back, to go back to the
 33 jail, those are dollars that we can use to --- to deliver
 34 much-needed services elsewhere in the budget and improve
 35 the quality of life across the county.
 36 So I want to --- I want to give kudos to our
 37 leadership in the county, and thank them for the work that
 38 they have been doing with me, personally, over the past
 39 several years to try to create additional opportunities
 40 for folks to have family-sustaining careers and something
 41 that they can be proud of. So thank you, sir.
 42 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 43 Representative Catena?
 44 MR. CATENA: Thank you, Mr. President. I would
 45 just like to thank County Manager McKain and the

1 Representative DeMarco?
 2 MR. DEMARCO: Thanks, Mr. President. On March
 3 30th, I also had the pleasure, with a number of other
 4 council members here, Councilman DeWitt Walton,
 5 Councilwoman Means, Councilman Baker, we had the
 6 opportunity to tour the County Jail. And if folks recall,
 7 a few weeks ago there was a protest outside there, a
 8 protest group that caused some trouble. They break some
 9 windows. They did some damage and the jail was in the
 10 news.
 11 I've got to tell you, I was very impressed with
 12 what I saw. I think Warden Harper is doing a great job,
 13 you know, over there. He and his staff took us around.
 14 We were able to go anywhere that we wanted, and talk to
 15 anybody that we wanted to, and I believe that they're
 16 doing some groundbreaking activities out there to try to
 17 reduce the rate of recidivism with some of our inmates.
 18 I believe everybody that we saw was treated very
 19 --- was properly. The place was spotless. There are
 20 video monitors everywhere, so I'm very confident in the
 21 operation of our jail, and I think those guys over there
 22 are doing a great job, and I just wanted to share that.
 23 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 24 Yeah, go ahead, Representative Kirk.
 25 MS. KIRK: I also went on a jail tour the
 26 following week. And one of the things that is very
 27 groundbreaking at our jail that they're actually asking
 28 them to write it up because no one's doing it, is the work
 29 they're doing with juveniles, and all the proactive work
 30 and the education, trying to stop the cycle.
 31 And it's going to be --- probably we'll hear
 32 more about it because they probably will try and make a
 33 little more publicity out of it for all the work they're
 34 doing and --- and once again, I also agree and the floor
 35 you could eat off of, I'm just saying. It's as clean as
 36 any hospital over there and --- and you have to
 37 congratulate Warden Harper on that, also.
 38 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 39 MR. PALMIERE: Mr. President, just ---
 40 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Go ahead.
 41 MR. PALMIERE: Thank you. Just to elaborate a
 42 little bit on Councilwoman Means, when we attended the Dan
 43 Miller --- excuse me, exercise out there it was --- I want
 44 to tell you I've attended many, many of these over the
 45 years. But the presenters out there and the information

1 department heads. Over the past six weeks, for me to get
 2 familiar with what I have to do, obviously, as an
 3 Allegheny County Councilman, I have been spending a lot of
 4 time with all of the various department heads, learning
 5 each of the departments and learning what they're facing
 6 on a daily basis. And they spent a lot of time with me
 7 getting me up to speed on everything so I could be
 8 effective at what I do, and I just wanted to thank them
 9 all for --- very much for that opportunity.
 10 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Seeing no more, we'll
 11 go to 10 --- 10104-17.
 12 MR. BARKER: A Resolution of the County Council
 13 of Allegheny County approving the attached document as
 14 2017 Allegheny County Storm Water Management Plan pursuant
 15 to 1978, October 4th, P.L. 864, No. 167, known as the
 16 Stormwater Management Act. Sponsored by the Chief
 17 Executive.
 18 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Would that go into Public
 19 Works?
 20 MR. BARKER: Yes.
 21 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah, put it into Public
 22 Works. Okay.
 23 The basketball team ---
 24 MS. MEANS: I wanted to make a comment about the
 25 Stormwater Management bill.
 26 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Go ahead.
 27 MS. MEANS: And where did that get sent, Public
 28 Works?
 29 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah.
 30 MS. MEANS: Okay.
 31 Well, I just was a little disappointed because
 32 when this was noticed, we didn't get a copy of the
 33 ordinance. We just got the little couple page resolution.
 34 And I guess I was disappointed more for the citizens in
 35 that the resolution cited a website. But at the website,
 36 the actual --- the latest version of the ordinance wasn't
 37 there until one o'clock on Monday afternoon. So it didn't
 38 afford the citizens, and even myself, an opportunity to
 39 look over this document and see what changes were made.
 40 And you know, my --- so I couldn't --- so I
 41 don't know if my concerns were addressed, and I don't know
 42 that other citizens of Allegheny County had the
 43 opportunity, also, to review it. Now I know it's just
 44 being introduced today. It's not the end of the story,
 45 but I --- I just really was disappointed because if

1 it is --- if it wasn't on the website until one o'clock
 2 yesterday, people didn't have a chance to take a look at
 3 it.
 4 And I was also wondering if we could get a
 5 redline copy of this, so that I could figure out what
 6 things were changed because I --- I know this is --- has
 7 been a work of many years, and there's been many
 8 revisions, but I would like to know what the latest
 9 revisions were before we got it, so thank you. I --- I
 10 don't know if anybody is here than can address that or
 11 not, but thank you for recognizing me.
 12 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. All right. Let's ---
 13 we're down to what? New business motions.
 14 MR. DEMARCO: Mr. Chairman, Point of personal
 15 privilege?
 16 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah.
 17 MR. DEMARCO: I'd like to make a motion that we
 18 go into executive session here, to get an update and
 19 discuss personnel and staffing issues.
 20 MR. FUTULES: Second.
 21 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Can you hold that a minute?
 22 We'll ---
 23 MR. DEMARCO: Sure.
 24 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: --- act on it.
 25 MR. FUTULES: His proclamation (indicating).
 26 MS. KIRK: Yes (indicating).
 27 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: What's that?
 28 MS. MEANS: The motion, there's a motion on the
 29 floor. Then we have to take a vote.
 30 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 31 Let's take ---
 32 MR. DEMARCO: We can --- we can delay going back
 33 until we do that (indicating), but I just made the motion
 34 and it was seconded.
 35 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Oh, okay.
 36 Let's have the basketball team in --- he agreed
 37 that the whole ---
 38 MR. BAKER: So I know we've met half the group,
 39 but let's meet the other half of the group. Everyone come
 40 on back up. We've got Mr. Penn State, Mr. U Penn, a
 41 couple sophomores. So yeah. Hi, guys. So --- yeah, so
 42 we --- we read the proclamation earlier. Congratulations
 43 to Moon Basketball 5-A champions in the WPIAL. We're very
 44 proud of you guys. The good news is the other half of you
 45 are here now, so we can do a full, full group photo, which

1 will be great. But we're proud as --- as your District
 2 One representative, I'm very proud. I know my other 14
 3 colleagues are very proud of you guys --- unless you
 4 defeated somebody from their district, then they're less
 5 proud of you, but very, very good job. Maybe for the
 6 young men that we didn't meet yet, if you could just share
 7 your grade, what position you play on the team and for the
 8 seniors, they shared a little bit about where they were
 9 going to college. So do you want to kick us off?
 10 MR. STERATORE: Yeah. My name is Frankie
 11 Steratore and I'm --- I'm a forward.
 12 MR. BAKER: And what year are you?
 13 MR. STERATORE: And I'm a junior.
 14 MR. BAKER: A junior. Okay.
 15 Very good. Hi, how are you? Congratulations.
 16 MR. HUMPHRIES: My name is Devontae Humphries,
 17 I'm in 10th grade. I'm a small forward.
 18 MR. BAKER: Very good, congratulations.

 28 I'm one of the assistant coaches for the team, and we
 29 wanted to just say thank you guys very much for
 30 acknowledging this and giving this --- giving us the
 31 opportunity to come up and receive these awards, so we do
 32 appreciate that. So thank you very much.
 33 (Applause.)

 19 MR. KLEIN: Yes.
 20 MR. BARKER: Mr. Kress?

 22 MR. BARKER: Mr. Macey?
 23 MR. MACEY: Yes.
 24 MR. BARKER: Mr. Martoni?
 25 DR. MARTONI: Yes.
 26 MR. BARKER: Ms. Means?
 27 MS. MEANS: Yes.
 28 MR. BARKER: Mr. Palmiere?

 31 MS. RANALLI-RUSSEL: Yes.

 9 (Chorus of ayes.)
 10 Opposed? The ayes have it. Thank you.
