1 I've spent more than my fair share of hours in here, I
 2 think more than 240, but I just want to recognize --- we
 3 have a number of members of Troop 646 here this evening as
 4 well. In addition to being the assistant scout master for
 5 the troop and the proud father of the honored Eagle Scout
 6 tonight, I'm also the counselor for citizenship in the
 7 community merit badge and one of the requirements for this
 8 merit badge is that the scouts attend a meeting of a local

 6 --- I'm humbled to do this, to have this opportunity

1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be referred to the
 2 Committee on Budget and Finance. New Business Motions, we
 3 have none.
 4 MR. BAKER: Mr. President, would it be okay to
 5 go back to Liaison Reports I think we ---
 6 MR. PRESIDENT: Okay, yeah. Go ahead.
 7 MR. BAKER: Oh, okay. All right. Thanks ---
 8 thanks, Mr. President.
 9 MR. FUTULES: Do you have one?
 10 MR. BAKER: I do have a few, but a lot of these
 11 incorporate other folks on the dais as well. So we did
 12 have our fourth annual District 1 town halls this summer
 13 again. They're great. They were July 30th and August
 14 14th. Our one in North Fayette on July 30th, had about 50
 15 to 55 people, our one on August 14th in Ross had about 30
 16 --- 30 to 35 people so we had close to 100 people at our
 17 two town halls.
 18 This year, we had the District 1 difference
 19 makers who were honored at the event. I think that had a
 20 really nice element to it. And just to put them in the
 21 public record, John Bay and Linda Francis, Art Hazen, Tom
 22 Jarvey, Cindy Johnson, Chaz Kelleem, John Lee, Christina
 23 Comen, Sylvia Lynn, Magulieks, the President of CCAC North
 24 Gretchen Mullin-Sawicki, Gwen Ogle, Lawrence Chee, Beth
 25 Syster, Debbie Suka, and Marisa Saunders.
 26 Just, literally every person that Sam and I ---
 27 Councilman DeMarco and I were about to honor them, I was
 28 just blown away by the incredible things that they did to
 29 make a difference all throughout District 1 and through
 30 our community. So those were great. Thanks to my Council
 31 colleague, Councilman DeMarco for partnering again with me
 32 on the town hall this summer. They were great.
 33 We did have the Marketing Committee meeting. I
 34 sent out some brief notes and then Aaron Pittman and the
 35 team sent out fuller notes on August 15th. That was the
 36 first time that the group met. I think we'll have a lot
 37 of good takeaways, and there were things that a lot that
 38 were there learned, of even small things that we can do to
 39 serve folks in our District better and to get to the word
 40 out. Thanks to Council Members Palmiere, Ranalli-Russell,
 41 Catena and Kirk for being a part of that. Thanks
 42 Councilwoman Kirk for the ride home because my car was in
 43 the shop that day as well.
 44 And speaking of riding to places, we had a
 45 historic day in District 1 yesterday. It was the first

1 MR. FUTULES: I have one.
 2 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Representative
 3 Futules?
 4 MR. FUTULES: Okay. Last week in the news,
 5 Allegheny County Parks always has what we call Pooches in
 6 the Pool. It'll be held on September 3rd from 4:00 to
 7 6:00. It marks the end of the pool season, so bring your
 8 dogs to the pool and you must have a current license, you
 9 must have a rabies vaccine license, and it is \$15 per dog
 10 and tickets are available at the pool or through Allegheny
 11 County Parks program.
 12 It also says here that --- I'm not clear on
 13 this, Willie, maybe you can help me. The spray parks at
 14 Deer Lakes and Round Hill Parks will be open from 10:00
 15 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. every day through Labor Day. Does that
 16 mean that you can take your pooches now?
 17 MS. KIRK: No.
 18 MR. MCKAIN: That's separate.
 19 MR. FUTULES: That's separate.
 20 MS. KIRK: It's people. That's people.
 21 MR. MCKAIN: Deer Lakes doesn't have a pool that
 22 just means for the regular, you know customer.
 23 MR. FUTULES: Okay.
 24 Well, I just wanted to make sure I'm correct on
 25 that. Don't forget to take your dog to the pool.
 26 MS. KIRK: And your kids to the spray parks.
 27 MR. FUTULES: And your kids to the spray parks,
 28 that's right.
 29 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Anybody else have their hand
 30 up? Seeing none, moving on to new business. No new
 31 business. Notification of Contracts?
 32 MR. BARKER: We have none.
 33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: We have none. We have
 34 public comment? Do you want to read them off?
 35 MR. BARKER: We do have several on general
 36 items. First up is Fawn Walker Montgomery. Not here,
 37 Second up is John DeLallo.
 38 MR. DELALLO: Members of Council, President
 39 DeFazio. I am, and you should also be, completely opposed
 40 to the concept of a civilian review Board. My Air Force
 41 included three years in Law Enforcement in '69, '70 and
 42 '71. I've assisted, over time a local police department
 43 and the use of force classes for women. I am a certified
 44 instructor with disciplines that include the ethical use
 45 of lethal force. I have written a copyrighted

1 ever shuttle from Westview, from the plaza there up to
 2 CCAC North. It's an issue we've been working on for years
 3 trying to get shuttle service. The thing that we were
 4 told over and over again by the school counselor at North
 5 Hills was that students that graduate from North Hills
 6 went to go to CCAC, they just can't get there. So this is
 7 the act of a school counselor who, working with CCAC and
 8 our colleagues there was able to make it happen.
 9 So we were literally sitting there at 7:30
 10 yesterday with our Diet Cokes waiting for the first ever
 11 shuttle. It did come, and it had some students in it so
 12 that was definitely a good thing. So congrats to Dr. Dave
 13 Barkovich on that. Councilwoman Kirk and I were at the
 14 Northland library for the 50th Anniversary. It was hot
 15 but it was well worth being here and it was really a
 16 special time, 50th Anniversary for Northland library.
 17 Two military events, both with Councilwoman
 18 Kirk, one with Councilman DeMarco as well. There was a
 19 military appreciation event at North Park on August 6th
 20 that Congressman Rothfus had and then the StarKist Korean
 21 War event was unbelievable. They had Councilwoman Kirk,
 22 Councilman DeMarco and I speak at it. It was just --- we
 23 were blown away by the stories of heroism that were shared
 24 at that event.
 25 So it's been a fun --- it's not really a recess,
 26 but it's been a lot of fun things going on. And I will
 27 say the best event of the summer maybe though was, we just
 28 approved him Brian Burley. We had an event with him for
 29 BBVS. It was one of the best events of the summer, so I
 30 think we did a good job nominating him and approving him
 31 today. He's a great young leader in our region. So
 32 thanks, Mr. President.
 33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Any other liaison reports?
 34 MR. DEMARCO: Yeah.
 35 MS. KIRK: Sam?
 36 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative DeMarco?
 37 MR. DEMARCO: What he said. Thank you.
 38 MR. FUTULES: I have one.
 39 MS. KIRK: Thank you for putting so much effort
 40 into that.
 41 MR. PALMIERE: Mr. President?
 42 MR. BAKER: I got to make sure the Boy Scouts
 43 learn a lot.
 44 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: One second.
 45 MR. PALMIERE: Mr. President, what did he say?

1 dissertation on Pennsylvania's Castle Doctrine. I hold a
 2 Bachelor of Science from Robert Morris.
 3 And with all of that said, I am woefully
 4 unqualified to judge the actions of sworn Law Enforcement
 5 Officers. I have no arrest authority. I've never
 6 attended the police academy. And even though my record as
 7 a citizen is spotless, save for a few parking tickets, and
 8 even though I vote in every election, and even though I
 9 consider myself to be in the two to three percent of well
 10 informed voters, I still remain hopelessly unqualified to
 11 pass judgments on the actions of a police officer.
 12 You must understand, as I do, that a police
 13 officer's life can change in a split second. Mine did,
 14 and that's why I moved to a less stressful career in the
 15 Air Force after a near deadly encounter. My life
 16 experience as a husband, father, Vietnam Veteran, Air
 17 Force retiree and Disabled American Veteran gave me no
 18 free pass to sit on a civilian review Board.
 19 Allegheny County has in place a robust system of
 20 internal reviews, a District Attorney who has shown he is
 21 willing to file charges after exhaustive investigation of
 22 facts, and police chiefs who understand that their
 23 officers and detectives must perform every mundane traffic
 24 stop with professionalism and decorum.
 25 County Government has no business interfering in
 26 the law enforcement field. Usurping the responsibility
 27 for oversight of law enforcement officers is folly. You
 28 must, at the end of the day, ask yourself how you will
 29 feel if an officer is distracted by, what's the County
 30 Board going to say, if even for a nanosecond and he's
 31 killed in the performance of his duties. And while that
 32 hopefully won't ever happen, have you considered the cop
 33 who will approach every call with an overabundance of
 34 caution?
 35 A Civilian Review Board is unnecessary,
 36 potentially dangerous and will do nothing to curb criminal
 37 activity. You must not cave in to a small but vocal group
 38 who refuse to take personal responsibility for the actions
 39 of a small socio-economic demographic, but who would
 40 rather place the blame for crimes on dedicated members of
 41 our law enforcement community.

 2 MR. THORNTON: Good evening. My name is
 3 Benjamin Thornton. I'm the President of the Allegheny
 4 County Police Association, and I represent 220 officers in
 5 the rank patrolmen, detective, sergeant and lieutenant.
 6 We are all employees of the Allegheny County Police
 7 Department.
 8 We would be the only department that the
 9 formation of a Civilian Review Board would effect and we
 10 are the sole bargaining unit under Act 111, the Policemen
 11 and Firemen's Act which discusses how we enter into
 12 contracts and our employment for the County. I heard it
 13 mentioned at the last County Council meeting that police
 14 officers should be certified just like hairdressers,
 15 nurses and teachers should be certified, and I didn't hear
 16 anybody stand up and say, wait a minute. The Municipal
 17 Police Act, Act 120, that requires over six months of
 18 training, is the certification that police officers
 19 operate under.
 20 And it doesn't matter if those police officers
 21 come from North Braddock, East Pittsburgh, East
 22 McKeesport, McKeesport or the Allegheny County Police
 23 Department. The certification is the same. It is a
 24 state-level certification. It is run by the political
 25 body in Harrisburg, and it's been codified in law for the
 26 entirety of my 17-year career and then a good bit before
 27 that.
 28 The Allegheny County Police Association pretty
 29 much stays out of political matters. We have never
 30 endorsed, nor have we opposed the endorsement of any of
 31 the people that you see sitting in front of you for
 32 Governor, for County Executive. We stay out of politics.
 33 We remain neutral. It's the same approach we use in the
 34 community. We remain neutral. If we have opposing
 35 parties, we get to the facts of the matter and we don't
 36 render our opinion we only discuss the facts.
 37 Right now, in addition to the Municipal Police
 38 Act 120 that certifies us in the beginning of our career,
 39 we have the Allegheny County District Attorney, we have
 40 our internal policies, we have our command staff. We have
 41 cameras and microphones in our cars. We have an internal
 42 complaint process, an external complaint process. All of
 43 this is widely publicized. You can stop in and speak to
 44 any supervisor and initiate a complaint to allege
 45 wrongdoing.

1 four 17-year-olds, black, Irish American, red hair and all

 4 up in it with the rest of them.
 5 If your son or daughter gets a ride home from an
 6 away game or takes a different route using Google Maps

 9 police force in the County addressing racial profiling,
 10 ethnic bias and other biases can be achieved if we have a
 11 civilian police review Board and the voters persuade their
 12 towns to join. Please take the first step and support the
 13 Allegheny County Civilian Police Review Board.
 14 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Next?
 15 MR. BARKER: Last up is Debra Smit, who does not
 16 appear to be here.
 17 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Not here?
 18 MR. BARKER: I don't believe she is.
 19 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 20 We're --- we're down to --- does someone want to
 21 make a motion to adjourn?
 22 MR. WALTON: Motion to adjourn.
 23 MR. MACEY: Second.
 24 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: All those in favor, signify

 3 especially when it effects such a small portion of the
 4 County and that would be the Allegheny County Police
 5 Department. Thank you for your time.

 7 MR. BARKER: Next up, Elizabeth Schongar
 8 MS. SCHONGAR: I'm Elizabeth Schongar and I'm
 9 speaking in support of a Civilian Review Police Board for
 10 Allegheny County that covers the County police and allows
 11 police forces within the County to join.
 12 My view is that any police force can make a
 13 mistake or have processes that can be improved. And while
 14 the County Council cannot enforce participation of other
 15 police forces, voters can ask their towns to join.
 16 Without a Board created by the County, a civilian police
 17 review Board is out of reach of many of the municipalities
 18 that need it most. A civilian review Board is a good way
 19 for small, under-resourced police departments to get
 20 individualized feedback on practical ways to improve.
 21 Over time, as findings and recommendations are
 22 provided to police departments, they, the police
 23 departments, can develop tailored improvement plans for
 24 their own situations. It identifies the problems that
 25 really exist locally. Certainly, there are many
 26 well-managed, excellent police departments in our County,
 27 but there are over 100 police organizations. Just because
 28 your constituents live in areas with excellent police,
 29 does not mean there is no impact on your constituents when
 30 other areas of the County have police that are not
 31 functioning that well.
 32 People drive all over the County every day. I
 33 live in South Park, which is one of the safest towns in
 34 the United States. We are very proud of our police. And
 35 every day I commute into Pittsburgh through Baldwin,
 36 Whitehall and Brentwood, whose police were present when
 37 Jonny Gammage died. When I take my grandson to Kennywood,
 38 we drive through many small towns that I could not even
 39 name.
 40 And consider my son's experience. My son's
 41 father is black, and he looks it. When he was a teenager,
 42 we lived in a community in New Jersey with an excellent
 43 police force. One day, he drove to the movies with his
 44 best friends outside our town and they were stopped by the
 45 police after the movie in the parking lot. The police saw
