COUNCIL RECOGNIZES THE SELFLESS SERVICE OF OTHERS

NURSES: INSPIRE, INNOVATE, INFLUENCE

May 6th through the 12th is observed as *National Nurses Week*, and during the May 8, 2018 Regular Meeting of Council, Council Members Cindy Kirk, Sue Means and All Members of Council came together to proclaim *Nurses Week* in Allegheny County. The Council Members took that time to recognize the selfless service of nurses and the overall importance of quality nursing care. The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has 143,130 licensed nurses and Allegheny County has 31,260 licensed nurses, which makes nursing the largest licensed health care profession throughout our Commonwealth and County.

HONORING CORRECTIONAL EMPLOYEES

During the May 8, 2018 Regular Meeting of Council, Council Members Sue Means and Sam DeMarco, declared May 6 through May 12, 2018 to be *Correctional Employees Week* in Allegheny County. Historically, correctional employees have been viewed as guards; however, in recent years, the duties of these employees have become increasingly complex and demanding. ALLEGHENY COUNTY TRANSPORTATION REJUVENATION

The Allegheny County Airport Authority is in the midst of a major Terminal Modernization Program (TMP) at the Pittsburgh International Airport in order to increase air service, improve customer service and inspire growth in the Pittsburgh region. The airport serves more than 8 million passengers annually on 16 carriers. During the past two and a half years, the airport has increased its nonstop destinations more than 80 percent to include 68 airports.

- ◆ Modernize outdated facilities to meet the needs of passengers and airlines
- ◆ Optimize infrastructure for new technology, security and passenger flow
- ◆ Eliminate space that is not used or needed
- ◆ Save money on maintenance of old and deteriorating systems

Allegheny County, the City of Pittsburgh, Port Authority of Allegheny County, and the Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh have proposed a Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) system that connects Downtown Pittsburgh with Uptown, Oakland, and several other communities.

Those in support of this project feel that in addition to enhancing public transit, this project has the potential to unlock development and contribute to neighborhood growth and link residents to job centers, educational opportunities, medical services, and cultural attractions. The project's current estimated capital cost is \$195 million.

Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) is a high-quality bus-based transit system that delivers fast, comfortable, and cost-effective services via dedicated lanes and fast and frequent operations.
