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Health Department Announces Ten New Food Establishments Licensed in May

PITTSBURGH – The Allegheny County Health Department (ACHD) announced today that ten new food establishments were licensed in the county in May, including four restaurants, one confectionary wholesaler, a grocery store, a bakery, and three coffee houses.

“The key to a healthy diet is choosing foods that have more good fats than bad fats, or trans fats,” said Health Department Director, Dr. Karen Hacker. “As part of our county-wide commitment to promoting individual and community wellness, we also look at and highlight those facilities that use trans fat-free cooking oils. We encourage all new eateries to take that step toward living well.”
